The celebration itself went back to basics with the whole school joining together to sing songs of praise for the food we eat and the countryside around us. Thank you to everyone who came along to join in our service of thanksgiving and to those who sent in the very many harvest baskets which were arranged by members of the HPA ready for the auction on Friday morning. I have always loved Harvest, as a time of year, as a special moment of sharing and of showing an understanding of life beyond the bubble of our school community and for the uplifting songs which capture a spirit of joy and optimism. It is a very honest occasion which remains immune from the commercial take-over which has somewhat swamped Christmas and Easter. Hazelwood's Harvest was pared back, even slightly rough around the edges but it was made all the more perfect because of this. a parent, as a Form Rep, as an HPA member and Chair and as the Registrar for over twenty-six years. Her three sons came to the school and she has been instrumental in shaping its history and more recently, its future. The Baily Building was conceived and delivered in her watch. She will be sorely missed with her calm and sage approach helping to keep the Governing Body and school on an even and balanced keel. As sad as we are to see Jo step down, we are equally delighted that Annabel Lark has accepted the position of Chair. Annabel herself has seen her three children, daughters this time, progress through the school and as Chair of the Education Committee worked closely with Mrs Shaw and Mrs Louw in developing the school's broad, challenging and balanced curriculum. Annabel takes over the role at the start of half term. The school will, in due course, be saying its goodbyes to Jo and showing our appreciation for all she has done. If you would like to share your memories and thanks with Jo, please do so through the school office.

At the end of Week 3 I feel that the school is well into its stride and life, whilst maintaining the zest and the zeal of the first few days back, has settled into a rhythm with children knowing where they need to be and by when throughout the day. The children who joined us on site after the summer break seem to have acclimatised very well to life at Hazelwood and it's as if the Year 1 cohort have been up on the Wolfs Hill site for ever! Do please remember that if you do have any early teething troubles or concerns my door, and those of the school's leadership team and other members of the teaching staff are always open. It is within my culture and my upbringing to be open and honest. I would not want us to behave in any other way at Hazelwood and firmly believe that this is the right approach for the good of our whole community.

News from The Nursery

It has been lovely this week to see the growing confidence of the children and even the youngest children have become more familiar with different routines. I have even had some of them come up for a chat when I come into their rooms which was delightful. This week Fledglings 1 have been using the clay to make wiggly worms. They have explored the giant soft play and the archway was a great success, even if it did frequently tumble much to the children's amusement. They have also been singing nursery rhymes and investigating different sounds made by the instruments. Fledglings 2 have been very 'hands on' with their messy play this week and have explored a whole range of different textures. They have also been making cows and cats, as well as their very own bus stop for their 'Wheels on the Bus'.

Bottom Robins have been on a bear hunt and found many bear paw prints – I am hoping not to meet the bear as he sounds very scary! In their room they have been sorting bears and enjoyed role playing in their new bear cave. Top Robins have been exploring the Elmer story and there have been elephants everywhere, some even made out of milk bottles.

In Skylarks they have been exploring their senses. The children have made their own musical shakers and have experimented to see how they could make loud and quiet sounds. They have been on a sense walk around the Early Years site, and heard, saw, smelt and touched lots of things on their adventure. The children particularly enjoyed searching for all the different types of leaves. This led to some excellent descriptive language and beautiful leaf pictures of their favourite animals. Amongst all that they still found time to work collaboratively to collect leaves and then see how high they could get them to go on the parachute.

Oak have continued their 3 bears theme and have made porridge, sorted and measured bears, been on a bear hunt and even had their very own crime scene, which needed a lot of investigation. The staff have been introducing the children to our new phonics and handwriting schemes and they are making excellent progress. There was intense concentration on their faces when using tweezers to transfer items from 1 bowl to another. Who knows maybe we will try the chopsticks next!

So a fun filled, busy week for all. I am still amazed it has gone by so fast, but it has certainly been jam packed. I look forward to seeing many of you next week for the curriculum evening.



Caterham Open Morning

The advertised Caterham School Open Morning clashes with a number of events being held off site this weekend. As a result, Mr Jones, the Head of Caterham (and former Hazelwood Governor) has agreed to host a special Open Morning for parents of Hazelwood School pupils who are considering either Year 9 entry to Caterham this September (2017) or a deferred Year 9 entry to Caterham in September 2019 (for our current Year 6 pupils).

A grateful shout out goes to the parents who are continuing to car share so that we do all we can to ensure a smooth drop-off and pick-up. Special mention of the week goes to the Mrs Murray who delivers the Detillens Lane posse in the morning. The children seem to be loving coming to school together even if it means Callum rides doubled up in the boot!

Caterham have recently introduced a deferred entry scheme whereby parents of children in Year 6 can secure a Year 9 place at Caterham. This option will particularly suit those pupils for whom Caterham offers ultimately the right level of academic challenge but for whom two further years at Hazelwood will give them the opportunity to experience leadership, to mature and to build confidence in a caring and supportive environment where the pupil, and their needs are better known.

The deadline for 13+ Deferred Entry applications is Friday 4th November 2016.



With deferred entry now being offered by Caterham, Reigate Grammar, Kent College and Worth (amongst others), senior schools are showing their understanding of the value of Prep Schools in preparing pupils for transition whilst equally appreciating that parents want surety of a Year 9 place being available for their child or children.

We played 'Who am I' where the children had to use careful questioning to guess what animal their partner had using fact cards of British Woodland Animals.



This was hugely enjoyable and we learnt that thinking about our next response is as important as coming up with lots of questions! The children also focused on respecting each other by listening carefully to each other, not interrupting and congratulating each other when they completed the task.





The lesson then moved into a maths and art session with the children constructing accurate sized pictures on the floor and decorating. Here are some of the results.
