Nursery



Blossom

Blossom have had lots of fun learning about shapes and have been very creative. The children have been using different shapes to print on paper, painting shapes to make a mobile and creating their own shape people. In the messy tray they have been making marks in flour, fishing shapes out of water using nets and shape ice play. We have also had fun visiting the library and down to the tennis courts. The children have also been planting runner beans in pots and in sandwich bags. Blossom have been building towers using different shaped blocks and playing with shape sorters.

We have also been learning about different fairy tales such as the three little pigs and the gingerbread man. The children have made their own magic wands, printed rectangles on to a large castle, sticking different materials on to the three little pigs house. They have been using tweezers to pick up peas, playing with the ponds tuff tray and exploring the three little pigs house in the messy tray. We have been listening to different fairy tale stories at carpet time and singing lots of animal songs. The children have been exploring gingerbread play dough and walking over the troll bridge. Also they have been matching different coloured gingerbread men and putting the buttons on the gingerbread men.



Maple

Maple has had a busy few weeks! We have been exploring the topic "Mini beasts," and the children have been involved in many enjoyable activities, including creating beetle sun catchers. They also had great fun finger painting ladybirds in the garden. We've been practicing our skills by sorting objects into big, medium, and small. This week, our focus has shifted to "colours." This morning, the children enjoyed matching colours together, which was a lovely activity. We have also been spending time in the garden exploring our outdoor messy tray and the bug tray.

Willow

Over the last couple of weeks in Willow, we have been learning about the story of Alice in Wonderland. The children have loved joining in with pretend tea parties with their friends, making cups of tea and sharing play food. They have also got involved in a variety of crafts, such as: decorating teapots, painting roses red and handprint painting to make flamingos. We have also been sorting heart and diamond shapes into groups and counting teacups up to 20. The children have loved exploring natural materials in the messy tray and have been mixing and filling up bottles with water to create their own "Drink Me" potions.



Elm

This week, we have been discussing holidays. The children have brought in some delightful photos of their recent adventures, and we have been exploring the various items we might wear on holiday. We set up an ice-themed sensory experience in the tuff tray, designed to resemble ice cream. The children thoroughly enjoyed using hammers to smash the ice, and we discussed the sensations of the ice as they played.

Additionally, the children have been rehearsing with Mrs Fryer on the stage in preparation for our summer concert next week, and they are excited to showcase their wonderful singing. We also visited the forest this week, allowing the children to familiarise themselves with their soon-to-be garden in anticipation of their time spent there in September.

Last week, we explored the theme of summer and holidays, and the children had a fantastic time enjoying the water play, especially given the lovely weather. We would like to kindly remind parents about our summer concert next Thursday, the 18th, and Sports Day on Friday, the 19th. For the concert, please ensure you drop your child off in the Elm room no later than 10 minutes before the concert begins, especially if your child will not be attending on that day.

Birch

Birch have had a very busy couple of weeks! Last week, all of the children recapped all of the skills they have learnt since starting in September, they were all amazing and blew all of the teachers away with their knowledge about phonics, they all sat together in circle time and were all able to recite the phonics they have learnt! The children also looked at counting, and were amazing at counting to twenty, they also began to look at numbers around the room and could find different numbers when asked to. The children also went on a phonic hunt in the garden and could sound out all of the letters they found hiding.

This week, Birch are learning all about holidays, during circle time, the children had all brought in images from home and spoke about their holiday they went on with their families, the children all loved talking about how they got to their holiday destinations and what they did whilst they were away too. The children have also been packing their suitcases and getting ready to board a plane, they spoke about what they needed to take on their holidays, and what they should be packing for a hot and cold holiday too. The children are all getting very excited for their upcoming concert, they are practicing extremely hard and can remember all of the songs and the actions too.



Hazel

Last week, we dove into the exciting adventures of 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. The children had a great time exploring various textures and scenarios that we set up in the room. It was lovely to see them recalling the story by looking at pictures and using shapes to create their own teddy bears. This week, we're getting into the World Cup spirit by learning about flags and football! The children have enjoyed crafting their own football pitch using different materials and then playing on it. They also learned more about shapes while helping create our giant England flag! We're all cheering for England!



Nursery



Pine

It was a veritable palaeontologist's paradise in Pine class as the children re-enacted exciting narratives against the backdrop of the Jurassic 'small world' table, revealed baby dinosaurs from the frozen eggs and explored the excavation tray in search of bones, fossils, and skeletons. They made their own interpretations of T. Rex skeletons using pasta to represent the bones and marvelled as they watched our volcano experiment, commenting on how the vinegar reacted with the bicarbonate of soda to create a fizzy eruption. The children absorbed new, specialised vocabulary and used it correctly during the week, words such as magma, extinct, lava and carnivore. They also tackled multisyllabic dinosaur names and grasped the concept of past and present. Our 'Little Chefs' event day uncovered some budding bakers as the children honed their practical skills of weighing, cutting, mixing, chopping...and eating!

The Jungle and its animals were our most recent focus, with the children going on safari in the jungle role-play area, alongside creating scenarios with the animals both in the jungle and in the swamp! We made paper plate lion manes and African necklaces and cut spiral snakes to further enhance our role play area. We read captivating jungle inspired stories and identified wild animals simply from their sounds, all of which contributed to our tropical rainforest ambience.

Acorns

Acorns have had an exciting past two weeks at Hazelwood Nursery! With our first topic of Jungle animals the children enjoyed making paper plate snakes, pretending to be jungle animals, and exploring the jungle rainforest water play! This week we explored the farm and our highlight of the week was certainly our trip to Bocketts farm! We had such an amazing time, and the children explored so much across the day- their favourite parts being the animal feeding and the piggy race! After such a busy day, the children enjoyed a quieter end to the week with plenty of fun crafts such as painting a large tractor!



Reception

Gingerbread Man

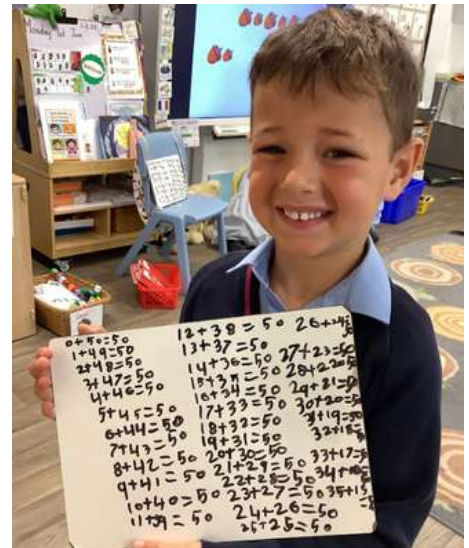
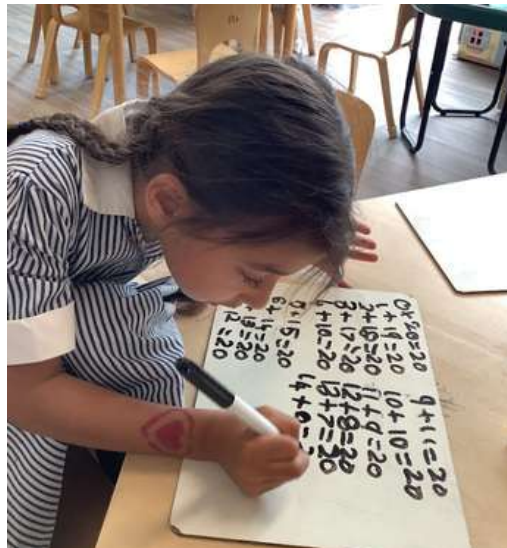
The children enjoyed exploring the story, "The Gingerbread Man". Following on from this, they worked on the concept of asking questions. One child sat on the "hot seat" pretending to be the Gingerbread Man and the other children asked questions. Questions included, "what is your favourite colour?" and "why did you trust the fox to take you across the river?" The children were encouraged to use a variety of question words. Then they wrote some questions, learning how to use a question mark.

Creating their own characters and writing stories about their adventures was also a highlight. Characters included, Hotdog Man, Cupcake Lady, Runaway Broccoli Man and Runaway Sushi Man!



Maths

In Maths, the children have continued to explore patterns with number bonds and working on quick recall of number bonds to 10 and beyond.





Year 1

In Year 1, we launched our new topic, How Has the Seaside Changed Over Time? The children have been learning about Victorian seaside holidays and comparing them with seaside visits today. We explored features such as beach huts and piers and discussed how the development of the railways made seaside holidays accessible to many more people.

In Maths, we have been working with numbers to 100, making, representing, and manipulating numbers in different ways to develop our understanding of place value.

In Art, the children created beautiful seaside mobiles using sticks collected during our Forest School sessions. They also used watercolours to paint seaside scenes, experimenting with different techniques to create the colours and textures of the sea.

In Literacy, we have been enjoying *The Snail and the Whale* by Julia Donaldson. The children have retold and rewritten parts of the story and have written detailed character descriptions of both the snail and the whale, using ambitious vocabulary and drawing on their knowledge of the text.

The pre-prep children are enjoying the lunchtime bird watching club. They have been learning how to use binoculars, keep tallies in their notebooks and listen for bird song.

It has been a fantastic start to our new topic, and the children have shown great enthusiasm for learning about the seaside, both past and present. Well done, Year 1!





International Day

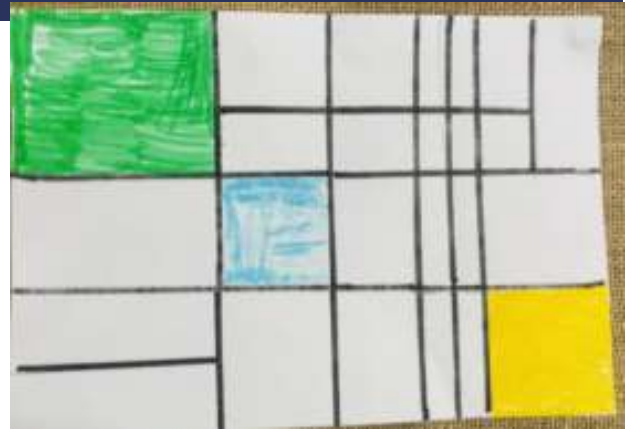
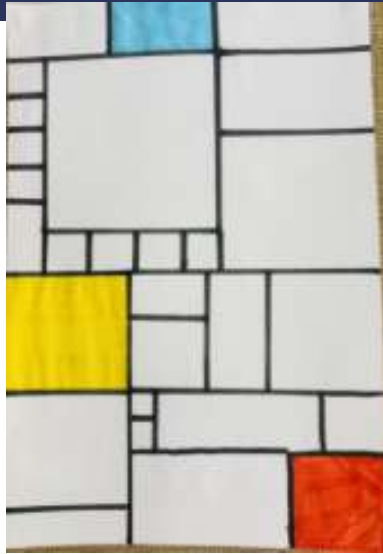
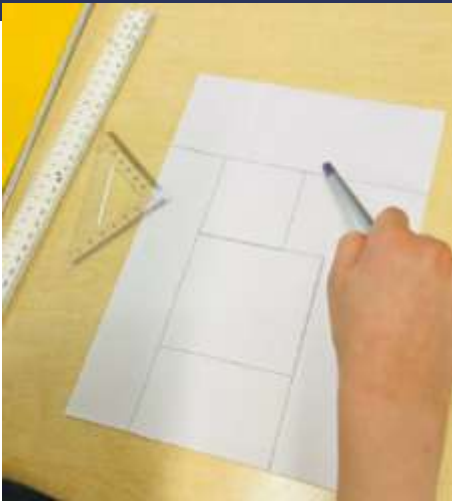




Maths

Trip to Bough Beech Reservoir

Year 4 had a wonderful, sunny visit to Bough Beech Reservoir. We learnt how water from the River Eden goes into the reservoir and is processed in the treatment works before reaching the taps in Oxted, Godstone, Edenbridge and the local area. The children learnt about chlorination, screening, clarification, filtration and the role of activated carbon and ultra violet sanitation. They enjoyed interactive water saving activities as well as a tour of the dam, tower and tunnel under the reservoir. We are all clued up on the importance of the water cycle and saving water in our current climate!

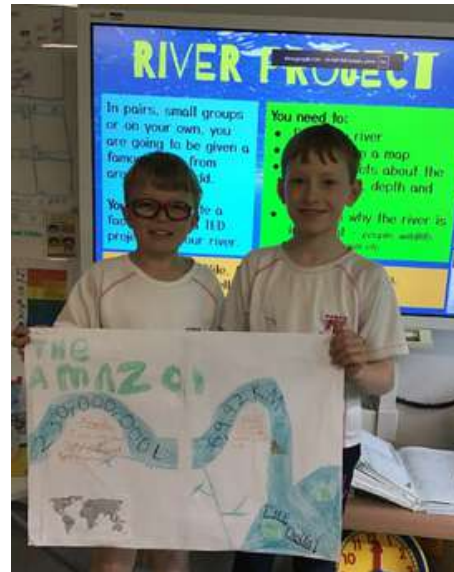
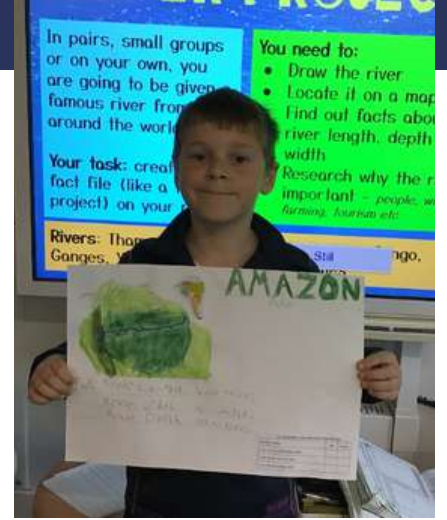
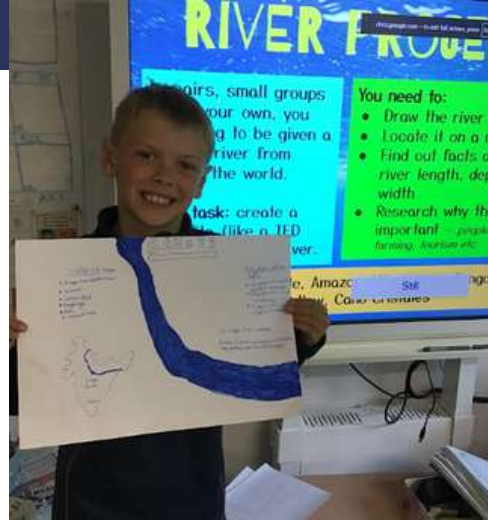
Year 4 pupils identified symmetry and symmetrical patterns and then created their own on canvas like William Morris.

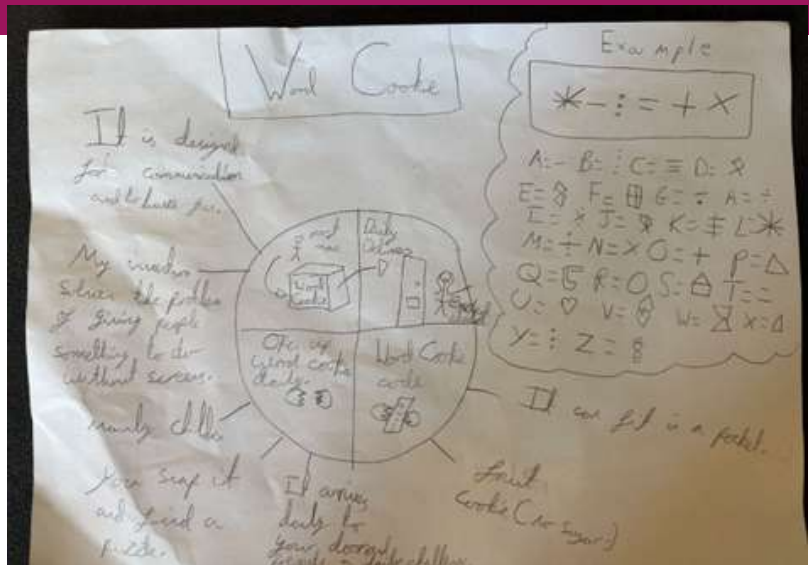
