Wildlife Pond Development

We're delighted to share the news that the wildlife pond, based on last year's SDG project, is now finished and ready to be explored and enjoyed!

The children and the Grounds Team have worked incredibly hard to provide a biodiverse wildlife space, that will improve as time goes on as more wildlife and insects begin to make it their home. There is currently one resident in the pond - a rescue goldfish called King Carrot!

We are incredibly grateful to the HPA, whose generous funding of approximately £70,000 this year has enabled us to transform our outdoor provision through enhancements to the pond area, the development of Forest School spaces in the Lower School and the creation of an outdoor classroom and sensory garden, which will take place during the summer.

Their support also includes funding towards a vehicle for the Estates Team, so we're able to extend our impact beyond the school in community engagement.

These initiatives will provide enriching, hands-on learning environments for all of our pupils.

Well done Francesca!

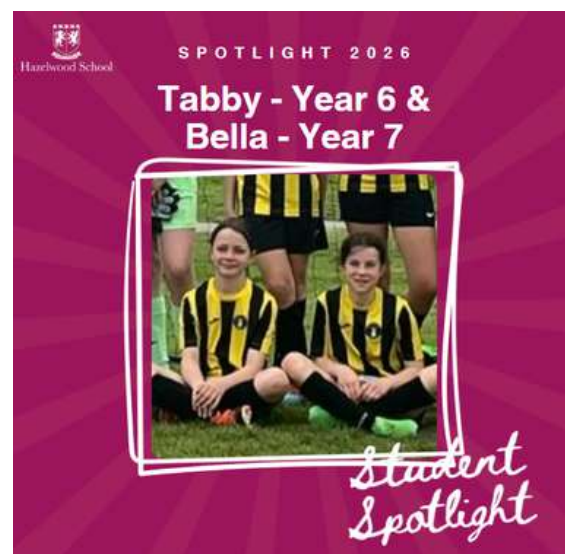


Joseph's team (Westcombe Park) recently won both pool leagues and they were awarded the trophy by Martin Johnson - a memory that will last a lifetime.

The children have really been into mark making and decorating a large fish. We have also been dancing and listening to under the sea music.

Maple has been quite busy over the last few weeks! Our recent theme has been “pirates,” and the children have enjoyed creating their own treasure maps using tea bags for painting. They have also been making little boats from paper plates, using their creativity to bring their sailing adventures to life. Over the last couple of weeks, we have been learning about minibeasts. The children have loved searching for hidden minibeasts in soil, grass and sand. We have also visited the nature area where we used magnifying glasses to look inside the pond at the wildlife. The children have taken part in a variety of craft activities such as: making snail antenna headbands and printing with paints to create caterpillars. We have been sorting bees into size groups and matching coloured worms together. The children have enjoyed listening to the story of The Hungry Caterpillar and have enjoyed group song time using musical instruments.



Elm

This week in Elm, the children have been exploring the theme of pirates. 🏴‍☠️ They have thoroughly enjoyed playing in coloured water, searching for treasure, and examining various shells of different sizes and shapes. We visited the playground, where the children engaged in imaginative role play on the pirate boat and practised 'walking the plank'!

Additionally, the children spent plenty of time running around in the grass area this week. Some of our activities included investigating objects that sink and float, as well as doing some delightful cutting and sticking with various pirate-themed items.

Last week, we focused on kings and queens. The children had a fantastic time colouring in pictures and working on pencil control sheets. We discussed how to identify kings and queens, noting that they wear crowns and often reside in castles. 🏰

Birch

We have been extremely busy exploring lots of different animals around the world! We started off by looking at animals in the jungle and reading the story: *There's a Rumble in the Jungle*. The children made their own snakes by painting them in a variety of colours and carefully cutting them in a spiral pattern to make a snake!

The children explored and shared the small world animals too and even pretended to be animals in the hall, they stomped like elephants and roared like lions! After the jungle explorations, Birch then began to venture into the sea; they are currently reading the story: *Rainbow Fish*, they are talking about sharing and are demonstrating their understanding of sharing throughout their play! They have been painting colourful scales to make a large fish for the display board and have also been making their own fishing rods too. In the messy tray, children have been painting colourful scales with the shaving foam and paint and have also been exploring sea animals in the water tray as well as cleaning the seashells too. Along with all of these fun activities, the children are working extremely hard learning all of the words to their summer concert songs!

Last week, the children at Hazel had a wonderful time exploring a Kings and Queens theme. They built castles in the garden, painted their own shields, and enjoyed imaginative play with castles and dragons at the small world table, bringing lots of princess stories to life. This week, we shifted our focus to the life cycles of various animals, including butterflies, frogs, and chickens, as well as the sunflower's life cycle. It was heartwarming to see the children's engagement with the process of creating new life and plants. We were especially fortunate that our cocoons hatched this week, allowing the children to witness this incredible phenomenon up close!

Pine

We've had a fascinating fortnight in Pine class, with the first week focused on minibeasts and the latter week's topic being growing. The children had plenty of fun starting our cress heads within egg shells filled with white cotton with the seeds then placed inside. We also participated in a sensory walk that involved walking barefoot whilst taking in a variety of flowers along with soil and water, then touching wood chips. Back in the classroom, plenty of play took place with the hungry caterpillar tray proving popular to recall the story. The hungry caterpillar sequencing cards were utilised as a maths game in order to challenge the children's skills.

The minibeast small world took in their 'home', with the children watching the animals through a magnifying glass. The children then appreciated a flower shop scenario where they sold bouquets from small to large to each other.

We finished the week with painting our salt dough bugs, making beautiful butterflies for our board. Ballet and forest school were enjoyed, with building and a good deal of physical fun enjoyed as well.



Acorns

Acorns have had a Roar-some week exploring dinosaurs! The children have been busy exploring the dinosaur swamp learning about omnivores, carnivores and herbivores. They have made exploding volcano paintings and read a variety of dinosaur themed stories! The children really enjoyed colouring on the whiteboard and have been practicing their summer concert songs!



Reception

Jack & the Beanstalk

Following on from reading different versions of “Jack and the Beanstalk”, the children have enjoyed exploring a range of activities. These have included building beanstalks or towers using a variety of resources, creating giants and writing stories as if they found a magic bean.





Year 1

We have launched our exciting new topic - How do bees help our world? We introduced our key text, *Humbug*, and began learning about flowers and the important role bees play in our environment. The children enjoyed planting with Jan, our gardener, and deepening their understanding of how plants grow.

We also had a fantastic trip to Gatton Park, where the children took part in pond dipping and a growing activity, learning about the different parts of a plant and what they need to thrive. Back in the classroom, we have been exploring pollination and the life cycle of a bee.

Our topic day was a wonderful success. The children brought in their own flowers, which they carefully drew and wrote about. They created honeycomb art, planted cress, and learned even more about bees from a visiting beekeeper, who showed them a real hive. In Art, we also painted flowers inspired by Wassily Kandinsky and created detailed observational drawings.

In Maths, we have been focusing on column addition, both with and without regrouping, and the children are building confidence with these methods.

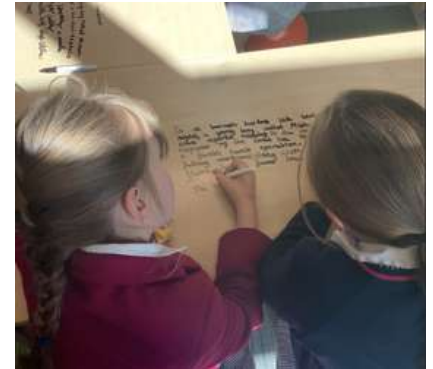
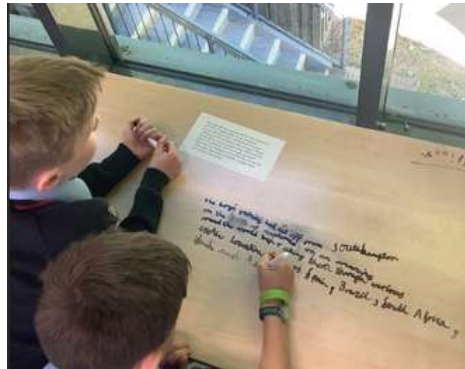
Year 3 are having a great time on their residential. Day 1 they had a brilliant day learning how to camouflage themselves and how to light fires. More fun tomorrow!

SHAKESPEARE WORKSHOP

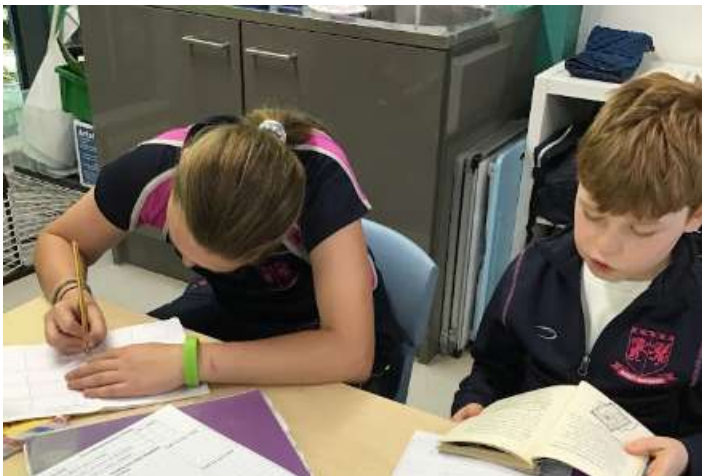

The boys' teams also enjoyed a hugely successful meet, particularly in the field events. Barney and Mikhail both dominated the Javelin competition in their respective age groups, each securing outstanding 1st place finishes. Max impressed in the High Jump, clearing impressive heights to take 1st place, while Max demonstrated tremendous strength and technique to win the Shot Put competition for Year 6.

One of the most exciting moments of the day came in the U11 Boys Relay. Harper, Zephyr, Siddharth, and George ran a superb race, battling all the way to the line in a dramatic photo finish, narrowly missing out after an incredible team effort.
