Celebrating recent highlights at Hazelwood

Dear Parents,

Following my end of Spring Term letter and the staffing update shared within it, I am now able to confirm the internal appointments to two of the roles that were still in process at that time. I referred to these broadly as our data roles, and I am pleased to now share some detail.

From September, Diane Watanabe will take on the role of Head of Assessment and Learning. This role leads the translation of assessment and data into improved teaching, learning and pupil outcomes across the school, working directly with teachers to raise standards and support progress. Alongside this, Roma Phillimore will take on the role of Head of Data and Performance. This role leads the analysis and interpretation of pupil performance data, ensuring that attainment and progress are clearly understood and used to inform teaching, intervention and decision-making across the school. Roma will also continue in her current role as Head of Maths, now as Director of Maths.

These appointments now complete our Education Leadership Team for September 2026. It is a strong and well-balanced group, bringing together a wide range of experience, perspectives and expertise. We are excited about what this team will bring, and the difference it will make for our pupils as we continue to strengthen all aspects of school life.

In the meantime, we find ourselves in a familiar period of waiting for a phone call. This term, we are due for our three-yearly inspection, this time under the new framework. As you may be aware, this framework no longer includes graded judgements; instead, it focuses on how well schools meet the required standards, alongside the quality of education, leadership, and pupils' wellbeing and development. Reports are framed around whether these standards are met, with clear next steps to support ongoing improvement, and, where appropriate, recognition of particular strengths. As I have been preparing for meetings with inspectors, I have found myself reflecting on just how much has taken place over the past three years. It felt timely to share some of this with you, as part of that reflection on what we have developed together as a community.

This includes the continued evolution of our educational approach, from our work around the Learning Wheel to increasingly adaptive classroom practice. Alongside this, pupils have taken a leading role in initiatives such as our SDG projects and the Kindness Collective (formerly the Hygiene Hub). We have also continued to build connections with families through Parent Insights, and to strengthen partnerships with organisations such as the Orpheus Centre, the Lucy Rayner Foundation and other charities.

We have also made a number of developments to the school environment. These include the addition of Reception at the Hazelwood site, the expansion of the Nursery with enhanced leadership and refurbished spaces, and wider improvements such as outdoor play areas, flexible classrooms, the Ruth Bourne Building, the redevelopment of the pond area, and enhancements to DT and Food Technology provision, alongside the Wellbeing Hub and Hazelwood Assessment Centre.

We are also very grateful to the Hazelwood Parents' Association (HPA) for their continued support. Their funding this year has played a significant role in moving forward our SDG work, from outdoor learning spaces and Forest School development to the Kindness Collective, extending opportunities for our pupils and the wider community.

Alongside these developments, our pupils continue to move on successfully to a range of senior schools, with recent outcomes reflecting the progress made, particularly in Years 7 and 8. We have also continued to invest in the development of our leadership team and to think carefully about how best to evolve our approach to education.

We will, of course, let you know when the call comes. With just 24 hours' notice, we are ready and very much looking forward to showcasing our work, as well as reflecting on our next steps as we continue to refine and improve what we offer our children and wider community. The inspection will take place over two and a half days, and the children's experience in school should continue very much as normal.



# Nursery



## Blossom

The children have been learning about Spring and doing lots of fun activities. They have been planting herbs in pots and watering them. They have been making clouds with rainbows, pom pom printing sheep and using flowers to print paint patterns. We have also been pulling pipe cleaners out of a colander, finding bugs with magnifying glasses, and using tweezers to pick up coloured pom poms. In the messy tray they have been exploring cocoa powder and flowerpot, shaving foam sky with birds and lily pond using chia seeds and frogs. We have also been singing lots of songs about spring and reading books about animals.

We have been learning about The Hungry Caterpillar and watching our own caterpillar grow. We have been collaging our own caterpillar using different coloured circles and finger painting symmetrical butterflies. The children enjoyed having their lunch and snack in the garden. In the messy tray the children have been exploring coloured rice in the shape of a caterpillar and exploring flowers and bugs.



## Maple

Maple has had lots of fun over the last few weeks. We have been exploring the theme “the hungry caterpillar” for the past two weeks. The children have been engaging in lots of fun activities and have even been given their own caterpillars to grow. During snack time the children made their own fruit kebabs. This week, the children have been making butterfly sun catchers and looking at flashcards that follow the life cycle of a caterpillar!



# Nursery



## Willow

Over the last couple of weeks in Willow, we have been learning about Spring. The children have loved joining in with various craft activities, making their own chicks using feathers and creating bumble bee sun catchers. We also made a large scale blossom tree within a group for our Spring display. The children have been sequencing using flowers and we have been singing counting songs up to 5. We have loved getting outdoors in the sunshine and have been exploring water play with nets and ice play with hidden flowers inside. The children particularly enjoyed visiting the nature area where we observed the pond, flowers and wildlife.

## Elm

This week in Elm, we have been exploring numbers, shapes, and letters! The children thoroughly enjoyed using paint brushes to create shapes and letters in flour, as well as fishing for numbered fish in the water tray with nets. 🐟

We also engaged in some shape tracing activities and sequenced numbers 1 to 5 on a caterpillar. One group had fun matching shapes using magnetic pieces.

Last week, our focus was on life cycles. We examined the life cycle of a butterfly using different shaped pasta. Additionally, we crafted beautiful symmetrical butterflies that now adorn our proud wall by the pegs, as well as our classroom.

We received a special delivery of stick insects and discussed how they are currently in the egg stage, with plans to hatch in a few months. We'll keep everyone updated on their progress in the coming months.



# Nursery



## Birch

Birch have been busy over the last few weeks with exploring Easter and going on Easter egg hunts, the children all told us how much they love chocolate and how many eggs they found over the Easter weekend too! The children had fun decorating their own easter cards and exploring a variety of different coloured easter eggs along with fluffy chicks and bunnies in the tuff tray, they have also been using potato mashers to make patterned eggs and have been completing easter egg matching puzzles too. Some very hungry caterpillars have joined the Birch room, and the children have loved learning all about caterpillars and watching them grow every day!

The children have also been exploring minibeasts and where to find them, with lots of bugs in the mud in the tuff tray and hunting for insects around the garden too. We have also been focusing on growing and spring; all of the children have planted their own sunflower seeds, they have all taken turns in watering the flowers too, the children have also been making their own flowerpots by threading the flowers through the cardboard. Birch have also been reading stories about farmyard animals and the baby animals that you can see in the springtime!



## Hazel

Last week, we had a fantastic time exploring the fascinating world of Minibeasts! The children loved discovering various bugs, learning about their habitats and how to care for them if they find any in their gardens. We also enjoyed a fun Minibeast hunt around the pond and in the Forest School area. The children played a delightful game called 'Moving like Minibeasts' and had a great time climbing like spiders on the big climbing equipment in the playground. This week, we shifted our focus to Space, and it was wonderful to watch the children engage with the different planets, asteroids, and rockets. They had a blast creating their own rockets using various shapes and the letters of their names. It was especially rewarding to see many of them identifying the phonetic sounds of the letters they were using, which was amazing! They also created aliens using a variety of materials.



# Nursery



## Pine

The children consolidated their understanding of the world and broadened their horizons during 'International Week', as they were exposed to animals, flags, music and cuisine from around the world. We enjoyed a diverse selection of food during our international banquet, matched traditional dishes to their country of origin and even learned to recognise some country's flags. Our 'small world' provision was set up with animals from around the world, sparking conversations about which animals lived in the deserts, mountains, snow or jungle and how they adapted to living in such habitats. We played international music, including Spanish guitars, Australian didgeridoos and Scottish bagpipes, and the children reflected how this music made them feel through their large-scale paintings.

Easter provided a wonderful opportunity to learn about another festival and to make some delicious chocolate nests and take part in a whole class Easter egg hunt! It also instigated a seamless transition into our Spring topic. The children showed a keen interest in this season and the changes it brings to our natural environment. They used nets, pots and magnifying glasses to explore the pond tuff tray, sequenced the stages of the caterpillar and tadpole life cycles, made perfume from Spring flowers and created chicks, lambs and butterflies to adorn our display board. Activities naturally over spilled into the garden as we chose the best vantage points to hang our home-made bird feeders and went on a Scavenger Hunt in search of signs of Spring. The children enjoyed an exciting walk to Oxted library too, learning about the life of a librarian, the services on offer there and then relaxing with a shared story.



## Acorns

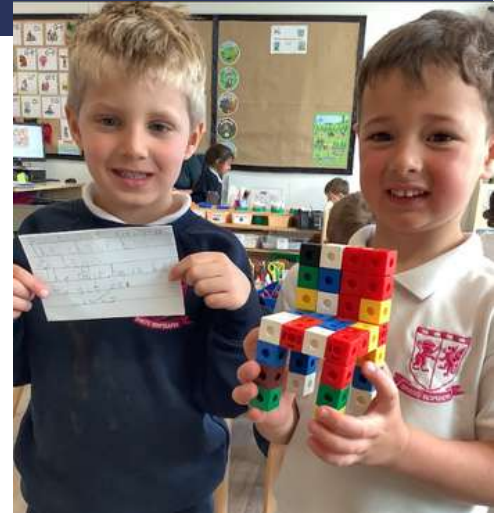

The Acorn children have come on leaps and bounds with their independence and understanding of the world. During International week, we created a Chinese Dragon and danced to music whilst we ducked and weaved. We looked at what causes volcanic eruptions and what lava looks like during an explosion. Since the weather has been getting better, we have made the most of our outside space at the nursery. Acorns have put on their best running shoes and begun practicing for sports day. It has been such a lovely term. Looking forward to the fun and adventure to come.

3M went on an archeological dig to uncover Ancient Greek artefacts and then tried to work out what each item was.





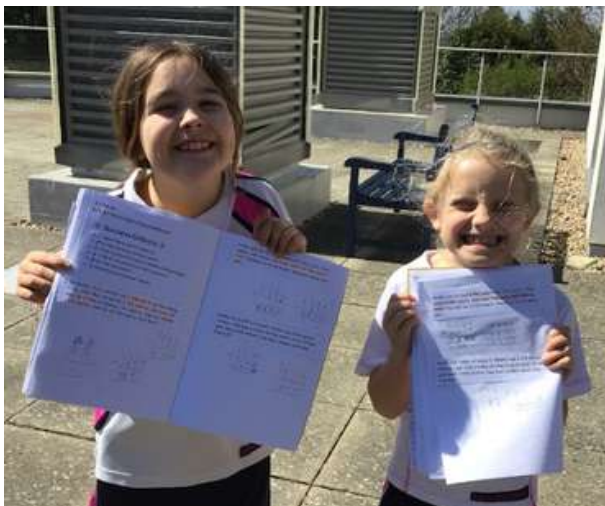

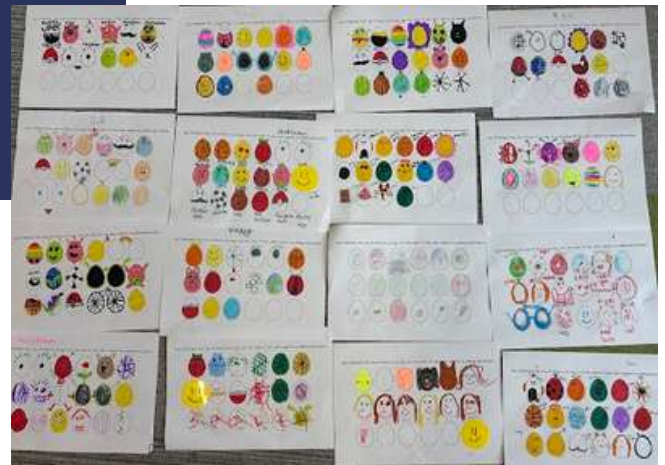

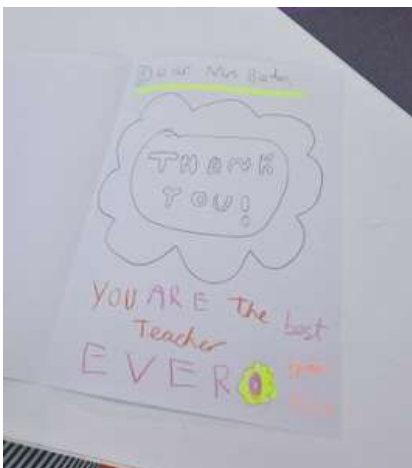


## KINDNESS WORKSHOP

## Swimming



At the Surrey round of the English Schools' Swimming Association competition, our U11 relay teams delivered a series of strong and competitive performances against a high standard of opposition in the Large Schools category.

In the medley relay, both Hazelwood teams swam with great determination and composure. Hazelwood A recorded a time of 1:20.14, with Hazelwood B close behind in 1:20.42, highlighting the depth and balance across the squad. The races were incredibly tight, with just fractions of a second separating several teams, making their performances even more commendable.

The freestyle relays saw another excellent showing. Hazelwood A produced a fast and controlled swim to finish in 1:08.79, placing them firmly in the middle of a very competitive field. Hazelwood B also swam well, touching in 1:12.27, demonstrating great teamwork and effort across all four legs. Across both events, the swimmers showed strong starts, improving takeovers, and a real sense of unity as a team. Their attitude poolside and their support for one another reflected the values we aim to instil through school sport.

A huge well done to all those who took part: Max, Immy, Oscar, Ralph, Freddie, Mikhail, Harper, Scarlett, Charlotte and Noah. Representing the school at this level is a fantastic achievement, and these performances provided a brilliant platform for their continued success at the regional finals.

The U11 Mixed team delivered an outstanding performance at the South East England Regional Finals, building superbly on their success at the Surrey Schools competition.

In the freestyle relay, the team produced a fantastic swim to finish 8th overall, improving their qualification time from Surrey Schools by an impressive 1.5 seconds. Each swimmer contributed to a fast, fluent race, with excellent takeovers and strong finishes making a real difference in a highly competitive field.

The medley relay team also showed great progress, improving their time by 1 second and moving up a position to finish 9th. Their effort across all four strokes highlighted both versatility and determination, with each leg executed with confidence and control.

Huge congratulations go to Immy, Max, Ralph, Mikhail, Noah and Oscar for their commitment, teamwork, and resilience on such a big stage.

### IAPS Swimming National Finals 2026 – Qualification Update

This is an outstanding achievement and reflects the hard work, commitment, and determination shown by all swimmers throughout the season.

The National Finals will take place at the London Aquatics Centre, the iconic venue from the London 2012 Olympic Games.

We are incredibly proud of all pupils who took part in the qualifiers. The standard is exceptionally high, and representing the school at this level is a significant accomplishment. We understand that not everyone will have qualified this time, but the effort, resilience, and team spirit shown by all swimmers has been excellent, and there will be many more opportunities ahead.





## Athletics

The Boys U9-U13 Athletics fixture provided a fantastic start to the summer athletics season. We were delighted to host teams from Ardingly, Lingfield College, New Beacon, Solefield and Brambletye, all of whom contributed to a highly enjoyable and competitive event.

Hazelwood delivered an outstanding team performance, finishing 2nd overall, just behind a strong Ardingly side.

There were a number of excellent individual performances from Hazelwood pupils. In the field events, our athletes excelled in the throwing disciplines, with standout performances in the javelin from Charlie, Mikhail and Barney, all securing 1st place finishes in their respective age groups, alongside a strong 2nd place from Milo. In shot put, Max and Theo both achieved 1st place finishes, with additional strong contributions from Raffy, Charlie, Danny and Barney supporting the team score. In discus, Hazelwood showed real strength with victories from Siddharth, Josh and Theo, alongside excellent support performances from Harper, Max and Henry.

In the jumps, Danny achieved a joint 1st place in the U9 long jump, with further strong efforts from George, Zephyr, Arthur, Milo and Campbell across the age groups. In high jump, Max impressed with a winning height in the U11 competition, while Robin and Campbell also produced strong performances.

On the track, Hazelwood pupils competed with great energy and commitment. There were several strong finishes across the sprint and middle-distance events, with pupils consistently placing highly in their heats. Notable performances came in the 150m events, where Hazelwood secured heat wins and top finishes, and in the longer distances where determined running saw multiple podium finishes.

What stood out most throughout the afternoon was the positive attitude and sportsmanship shown by all competitors. Pupils supported one another, celebrated success respectfully, and represented their schools with pride.
