Celebrating recent highlights at Hazelwood

Dear Parents,

This week at Hazelwood, our school community came together to take part in Neurodiversity Celebration Week, a global initiative that challenges stereotypes and misconceptions surrounding neurodevelopmental differences and learning disabilities.

Our focus has been on recognising and respecting that every mind works differently. As a community, we are committed to ensuring that our neurodivergent pupils feel seen, supported, and never alone, while also fostering a deeper understanding of neurodiversity across the whole school.

The week began with a whole-school assembly, where children were introduced to the concept of neurodivergence and explored key facts and statistics about how many people think and learn differently. Later that day, pupils watched a powerful film created by children and staff, sharing personal experiences of autism, ADHD, and dyslexia. Staff also engaged in meaningful discussions during Monday evening's meeting, collaborating to share effective strategies to support our neurodivergent learners.

Throughout the week, pupils have taken part in a range of immersive activities designed to deepen their understanding. These included solving coded puzzles, adapting to changing instructions, completing tasks while managing sensory distractions, and experiencing upside-down reading and mirror writing. These activities offered valuable insight into the diverse ways in which people process information and navigate the world.

The conversations sparked by this week's learning have been truly thoughtful and inspiring. There has been a clear shift away from viewing neurodivergence as simply a 'label', towards a richer understanding of individual cognitive experiences and how we can best support one another as a compassionate and inclusive community.

**She has been practising incredibly hard and is scoring higher than ever in TT Rockstars and has recently achieved an impressive 25 out of 25!**

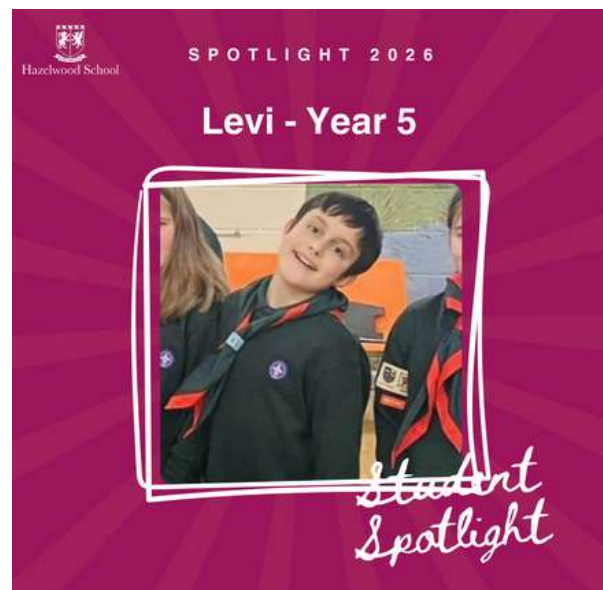
**Her Maths teachers are so proud of her!**

## Willow

Last week in Willow, our topic was The Rainbow Fish. The children had lots of fun exploring arts and crafts, creating their own fish by printing with bubble wrap and paint and dyeing cotton pads using pippets and food colouring. We have also been matching coloured Pom poms to the scales on a rainbow fish. The children have loved exploring various messy trays with hidden sea creatures in coloured pasta and oats.

This week, we have been reading "A book with a bite!" This is one of the children's favourites and they have loved listening to the story within a group. The children have made some musical shakers using rice and lentils and have been exploring the sounds they make. We have been sorting ducks into colour groups and have been counting crocodiles teeth. The children enjoyed visiting Birch's garden for a change of scenery and to explore their garden toys, trikes and balls.



## Elm

This week in Elm, we have engaged in numerous activities related to St Patrick's Day, alongside celebrating Red Nose Day on Friday. The children thoroughly enjoyed dressing in green on Tuesday to kick off our St Patrick's Day festivities. They coloured shamrocks and rainbows using bingo pens, and later ventured outside for a shamrock and gold coin hunt, which was great fun. On Friday, the children donned red in honour of Red Nose Day and looked fantastic.

Last week, our discussions centred around space and Mother's Day. We introduced the children to the names of the planets in our solar system and watched a short video of a rocket launching into space. We talked about the roles of astronauts, what they wear, and what is found inside a rocket. The children also created lovely Mother's Day cards, incorporating their handprints.

## Birch



Birch have had a lovely few weeks taking part in lots of fun activities. Last week we focused on lots of different science activities and experiments! The children began making their own gloop by mixing water and cornflour together and stirring it using spoons, they then began making their own predictions about another experiment in which they explored what would happen when they placed coloured water into clear water using pipettes. This week, Birch have been exploring different celebrations which include St Patricks Day and Red Nose Day.

They have all decorated their own red and green biscuits using icing and sprinkles. They have also taken part in dress up days where they enjoyed dressing up in red and green clothing. The children have also made their own St Patricks Day cards to take home to their families. Birch have also loved playing in the sunshine on the trikes and exploring the water play too!



## Hazel

The children had a wonderful time exploring the topic of farm animals and their families. With Mother's Day approaching the following week, we decided to shift our focus to "Our Family," incorporating activities related to this special occasion. To kick off, we started some planting activities, allowing the children to create lovely gifts for their mums to take home. We also provided a variety of materials for them to design their own heartfelt cards. Throughout the week, we enjoyed the book "Guess How Much I Love You," which sparked sweet conversations about their love for their parents. During circle time, the children shared how many members are in their families and drew pictures representing them. As we wrapped up our Mother's Day celebrations, the children expressed a keen interest in superheroes. This led us to explore the topic "Superheroes."

We began the week by reading "Supertato" and set up a small world tray featuring ice and peas for the children to break apart, which they found great fun. Through various materials, they also crafted their own superhero creations and were encouraged to describe what superpowers they would possess. Most of them said they would use their powers to rescue people! The Hazel group had a fantastic time using their drawings to invent their own superhero characters and will dress up as their favourite superheroes on Thursday.



# Nursery



## Pine

The children in Pine class had their literacy skills really put to the test during our topic on 'Traditional Stories'. We read lots of children's favourite tales which highlighted their comprehension, recall and grasp of how a story is structured. They enhanced these disciplines by sequencing story cards, reenacting narratives against the backdrop of the 'small world' table, tuff tray and role play area and recounting some familiar storylines in their own words during circle time. This theme was seamlessly extended into our 'Jack and the Beanstalk' focus, which also provided an opportunity for the children to sow their own broad bean seeds and understand what seeds, plants and flowers need to grow. We will enjoy investigating any changes that occur over time. The children explored these concepts further via sensory play in the garden tuff tray and by sequencing the stages of a bean's life cycle.

Other special dates celebrated in Pine class included Mother's Day, when every child made a beautiful card and spoke about why they loved their mummy, plus 'Red Nose Day', which we will enjoy supporting at the end of the week with some class, and whole nursery, fun activities.



## Acorns

Over the past two weeks, Acorns have been wonderfully busy! With our first topic of Jack and the Beanstalk, we all worked together to create a giant beanstalk! Everyone joined in to place colourful, numbered leaves to the top. It was such a fun collaborative effort!

This week, we enjoyed the sunny weather while exploring the story of A Squash and A Squeeze. The sunshine brought smiles to our faces, and we wrapped up the week with an exciting trip to our local Oxted library! It was a great experience for everyone as we learned about the role of librarians and discovered what libraries are for, followed by a lovely story read by one of the librarians!

# Year 1

In Literacy, we have been focusing on using -er and -est to compare, particularly when describing new and old toys. The children have also been practising their sentence writing skills and applying these in their work. As part of our History learning, the children created a timeline of toys across the classroom, ordering them from oldest to newest.

In Science, we have continued our learning about animals, focusing on mammals and reptiles. The children have enjoyed identifying features and beginning to group animals. In Maths, we have been exploring picture graphs and tally charts. The children even visited different classrooms to gather data about favourite animals, which they then used to create and interpret their own graphs.

In Computing, the children have been learning to use Bee-Bots. They created Bee-Bot art, designed their own treasure maps, and explored programming the Bee-Bots to follow routes.

We have also been busy preparing for our Spring Show. The children have been working especially hard in Music, learning songs and memorising their lines.

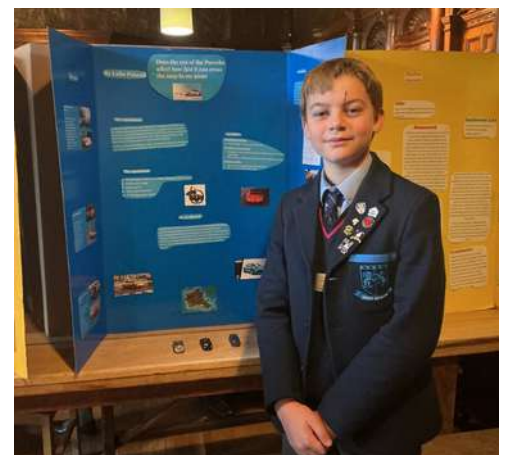
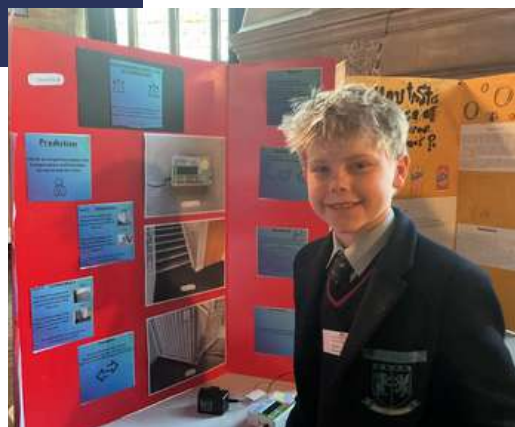


## SCIENCE COMPETITION

Theo tested the idea that temperature may affect the life of an iPhone's battery. He concluded that it does!

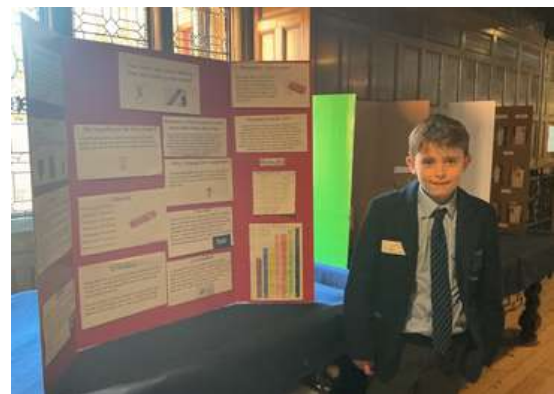
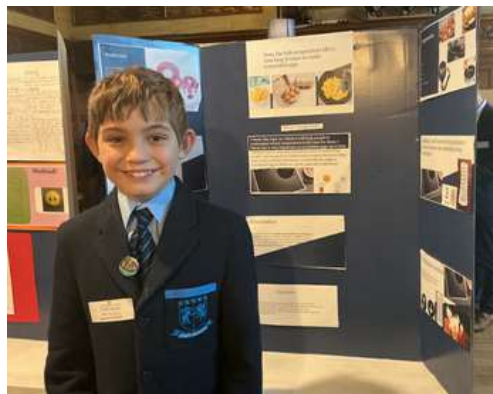
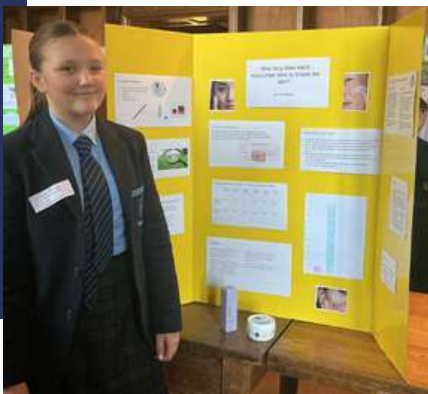
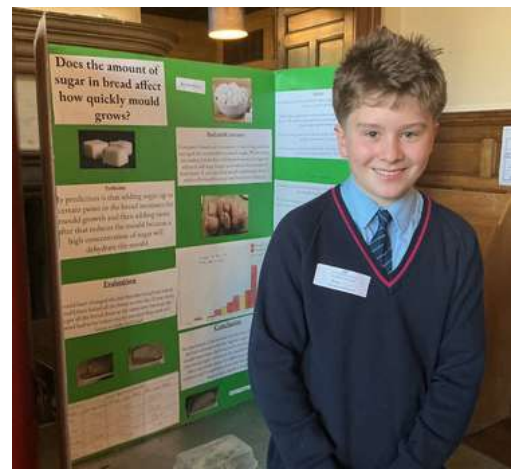
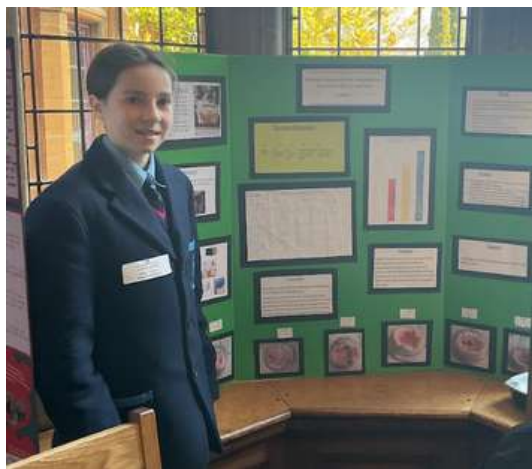
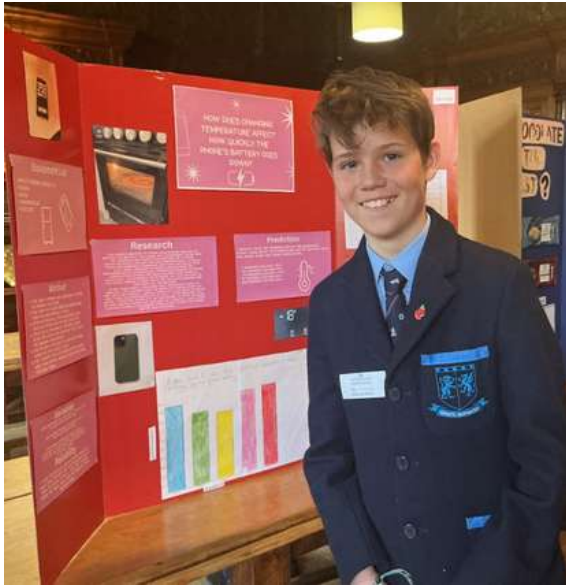

They have been enjoying singing along to the film and crafting little goat puppets. Next will be baking apple strudel and making play-clothes out of curtain material.

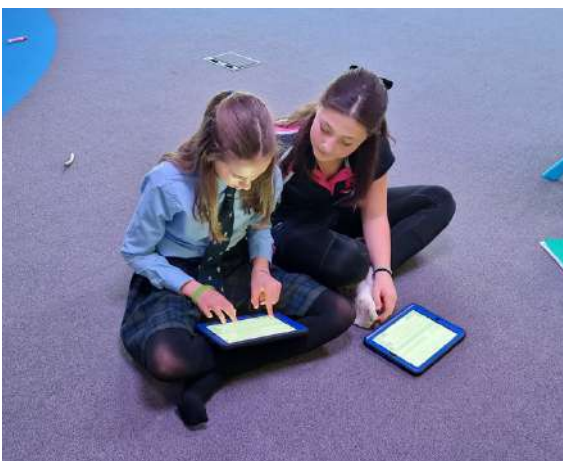


## BEDE'S MODEL UN CONFERENCE

On Tuesday, we were delighted to welcome students from Bede's School, who delivered an engaging and thought-provoking session for our Year 8 pupils focused on the work of the United Nations. The visit provided a fantastic opportunity for our students to deepen their understanding of global issues through a hands-on, interactive approach.

The Bede's students led a mini UN conference, where our pupils took on the roles of delegates representing different countries. Each student was tasked with speaking on behalf of their assigned nation, applying real UN conventions and debating a challenging motion: whether all countries should have access to space exploration. This encouraged pupils to think critically, consider different perspectives, and develop their public speaking skills.
