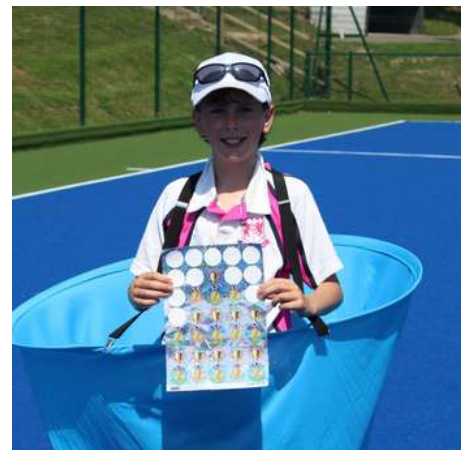

Swimming

Record-Breaking Splashes at the Hazelwood Swimming Championships 2026!

The energy at the pool was electric for the finals of the Hazelwood Swimming Championships 2026. With temperatures outside soaring to a scorching 35°C under blazing blue skies, the heat wave sweeping across the grounds was matched only by the blistering pace inside the pool. While the spectators melted in the stands, our swimmers turned the intense heat into pure fuel, delivering one of the fastest, most explosive galas in Hazelwood history.

This year's championship reached unprecedented heights, showcasing the incredible depth of talent, determination, and cooling composure across our swim squad. An astonishing 96 children initially dived into the pool for the preliminary heats, racking up over 180 entries across five disciplines. After fierce qualification rounds, the field was narrowed down to 65 finalists who stepped up to the blocks to compete for the coveted gold, silver, and bronze medals.

Turning Up the Heat: The Ultimate Peak Performance

The story of the finals was one of staggering individual progression despite the oppressive weather. An incredible 30 individual personal best times were shattered between the afternoon heats and the evening finals, proving that our athletes thrive under pressure.

Among the standout achievements, Ralph L (Year 6) delivered a masterclass in the Individual Medley, slicing a massive 6.57 seconds off his heat time to finish at a blistering 46.08. On the girls' side, Imogen Z (Year 4) displayed phenomenal explosive power in her Freestyle final, dropping nearly three seconds from her qualifying mark to touch the wall in just 20.78.

A Historic Night: 12 School Records Melt Away!

Our swimmers didn't just chase medals; they completely rewrote the Hazelwood history books. We can proudly confirm that 12 school records were broken during a single historic session of racing:

Year 3 Boys:

- Cooper K enjoyed a sensational double-record night, rewriting the 30m Frontcrawl record in 25.47 and the 30m Butterfly record in a rapid 28.35.
- Max K also etched his name into the books, setting a new 30m Breaststroke record of 31.78.

Year 3 Girls:

- Sienna A stormed home in the 30m Frontcrawl, setting a brilliant new school record of 22.75.

Year 4 Girls:

- Imogen Z added to her spectacular evening by claiming the 30m Backstroke school record with a time of 23.08.



Swimming

Year 5 Boys:

A powerhouse year group saw three separate records fall.

- Noah V took the 30m Backstroke record in 24.57
- Harper S claimed the 30m Breaststroke record in 26.41
- Freddie C flew to a new 30m Butterfly record of 23.14.

Year 5 Girls:

Scarlett P put on a dominant display 30m Breaststroke, lowering her own previous school record down to an incredible 26.80.

Year 6 Boys:

Max C standard-set, breaking two long-standing records in the 30m Frontcrawl (19.09) and the 30m Butterfly (21.48).

Ralph L completely smashed his own previous 4x1 I.M. school record, resetting the benchmark at a 46.08.

The dedication, effort, and resilience on display from every single swimmer on such a hot summer day was absolutely outstanding. You swam fast, you kept your cool, you left it all in the pool, and you made the entire Hazelwood community incredibly proud.
