

## **Staff Spotlight**







#### WHAT DO YOU LOVE MOST ABOUT YOUR JOB?

I love that no two days are the same. I can walk into school with the best-laid plans, but I'm not sure any day has ever gone exactly as I expected! I also love that I'm lucky enough to work with pupils across the whole school - I might be sitting on the floor in the nursery, reading a story to a group of three-year-olds, and an hour later helping an upper school pupil revise for their exams.

#### WHAT MOTIVATES YOU?

Early in my career, a parent gave me a copy of The Starfish Story. It's a short story about a person walking along a beach, throwing starfish that have been washed up back into the ocean. When a passerby asks why they're bothering, as they'll never be able to make a difference, the person returns a starfish to the ocean and replies, "Well, it made a difference to that one." I still have the copy I was given, framed in my classroom, and it motivates me every day to try to make a difference, no matter how small.

#### HOW DO YOU MAKE A DIFFERENCE TO CHILDREN'S LIVES?

My goal is to make sure every pupil feels happy and confident in school, so they can fulfil their potential. This may involve helping an individual pupil develop strategies to overcome any barriers they face or supporting and sharing knowledge with staff to help them create the most inclusive environment possible for every pupil.

#### WHAT ARE YOU LOOKING FORWARD TO THIS YEAR?

Christmas is my favourite time of the year, and I love being surrounded by all the festive cheer and excitement at school in the lead-up to it. Next year, I'm hoping to go away with some friends and take a break from my own children (love you really, boys!)



#### Wrens

The past few weeks the Wrens room have enjoyed doing activities based around Halloween and bonfire night. Wrens have enjoyed exploring frozen shaving foam ghosts and creating handprint spiders. We also have been carving pumpkins and exploring inside with different tools. They have been also making their own fireworks using forks and using teabags to splat paint to make a firework. We have also been creating salt and paint fireworks and edible sparklers.











### **Starlings**

Starlings have been focusing on the book Room on the Broom over the last two weeks. They have enjoyed exploring Halloween themed messy play, creating broomsticks using pipe cleaners, making salt dough wands and exploring various scented playdoughs. What a busy two weeks we have had!











#### **Wagtails**

The Wagtails have had so much fun learning about Autumn. They have been using their fingers to mix colours to make firework pictures. The children have been doing lots of creative autumn activities such as making a tree with autumn leaves, rubbing different shaped leaves and making hedgehogs using different coloured leaves. We have had so much fun going up to the nature garden and using nets to explore the pond. The children have also made their own poppy for remembrance. We have been counting leaves and collaging them onto a piece of paper. The Wagtails have had so much fun using different parts of their body to explore the leaves in the garden and making their own marmite swirls for morning snack.











#### **Lower Robins**

Last week in Lower Robins, the children thoroughly enjoyed discussing fireworks . They used cardboard tubes to create markings on their paper, representing the fireworks. We also emphasised the importance of safety during this time. Additionally, we have begun practising for the Christmas concert, which everyone is eagerly anticipating in December. This week, the children focused on Remembrance Day, creating hand-painted poppies that we displayed in our window. They also decorated plates shaped like poppies, which have been added to the display as well. Furthermore, we talked about Children in Need and worked on decorating a giant Pudsey bear for our window. In addition, we enjoyed some water play and experimented with coloured shaving foam.













#### **Upper Robins**

Last week as part of our topic "Rainbow Fish, Colours and Remembrance Day", the children enjoyed creating a giant handprint Poppy, they also loved mixing basic colours to create a new one using their hands. Additionally, they took turns to play the fishing game, where they put to the test their fine motor skills, and matching the fishes with the coloured buckets. This week the children turned their focus to our new topic "Winter", they have been exploring winter sceneries in the small world tables such as winter animals and Polar express trains.

They also have been creating their own snow man by putting them together, counting snow men, making melting snowman, learning about all the clothes we wear in winter and having a blast hammering the ice to free the frozen animals in the tuff tray.















#### **Skylarks - Green**

The children in Skylarks' Green have been enhancing their understanding of the world over the past few weeks. We have celebrated a variety of festivals and traditions which have highlighted the diversity of the world and its communities.

We enjoyed some spooky fun in our tuff tray and role play area, investigated the inside of a pumpkin and went 'trick or treating' around the nursery in celebration of Hallowe'en. We made beautiful firework pictures using a selection of media to create different effects as we focused on Bonfire Night and fashioned Diwali clay lamps and patterned Rangoli pictures as we learned about the Hindu Festival of Light. We observed a minute's silence for Remembrance Day and made individual poppies to take home. Another highlight of last week was our visit to 'The Box', where we explored the interactive environment of the indoor area and had fun discovering the pods, bridge and teepee located in the outdoor area.

This week our theme has been 'Transport'. We have learnt about the different modes of transport, made vehicles out of 'junk' modelling resources and instigated imaginative storylines against the backdrop of the 'small world' table and train station role play area. Some children created sail boats too and we also will be learning about road safety during circle time.













#### **Skylarks - Orange**

The Skylarks have had an incredible few weeks! We discussed the significance of wearing poppies on Poppy Day and reflected on how past generations have paved the way for our future. The children enjoyed crafting their own poppies by cutting bright red paper and decorating them with pride, which we have beautifully displayed in our classroom.

Additionally, we were treated to a special outing to the main school. We visited the box, then made our way to the igloo to conduct a rocket experiment. We combined a bottle of fizzy pop with some magical rocket tablets, which caused the drink to fizz up into the air. The children were thrilled and excited as they watched this experiment unfold, led by our room leader, Chloe. The fun continued in the inside box, where the children collaborated to create amazing Lego structures and had the opportunity to make marks on special tables











## Reception

#### **Autumn**

We've launched our new topic, exploring **what happens at this time of year** with a focus on **autumn**. We've discussed how nature changes during this season, like the leaves changing colour and falling, and animals preparing for winter by building dens or hibernating. The children have enjoyed learning about autumn's transformations through creative activities, like reading *Leaf Man* and using natural materials (leaves, sticks, pinecones) to create pictures of birds, animals, and even imaginative scenes inspired by our nature walk.

The children enjoyed creating autumn necklaces. Using a hole punch, they made holes in the leaves and then threaded them onto string.









#### **Science**

In science, we've started looking at how the weather changes in autumn, particularly the impact of wind. The children crafted parachutes, kites, and wind socks to see which designs flew best in windy conditions. We then recorded our observations in a bar chart, a wonderful way to incorporate early data handling into our activities.

#### **Autumn Festivals and Remembrance**

Our seasonal exploration led us to discuss Diwali, learning about why it's celebrated and how it brings light and joy to many families. We also marked Remembrance Day by creating poppies and talking about the brave soldiers who sacrificed their lives to protect us. The children showed thoughtful respect as they learned about this special day of remembrance.



## Reception

#### **Pastoral Day**

On Pastoral Day, the children had a fantastic time making "bubbling fireworks". They combined vinegar, baking powder, and food colouring, delightedly watching the reactions unfold. Their comments included: "There are bubbles on the surface; it's like a volcano with lava spilling out! It is like a firework exploding, and it keeps growing; it's erupting bubbles!"









#### **Maths**

Using a bus and animals, the children explored the concept of one more. A dice was rolled to generate a number, then the corresponding number of animals were placed on the bus. They then added one more. Some children wrote number sentences to show the calculation.

In maths, we've been focusing on finding 1 more and 1 less than numbers to 5 and 10. We also looked at circles and triangles, spotting these shapes around us in both the classroom and nature. These foundational activities have been a great way to solidify their understanding of numbers and shapes.






#### **Phonics**









#### **Maths**

In Maths, Year 1 has been learning how to create tally charts and bar graphs. Each child asked a question about a topic e.g. What is your favourite ice-cream? Who is your favourite Disney character? We then visited the Reception and Year 2 classrooms to conduct a survey using a tally chart. Next, the children put their tally results into a bar graph and wrote sentences about their findings!











#### **Modelling**

Year 2 pupils are bursting with creativity, particularly when it comes to modelling with plasticine! The entire year group model weekly, where they explore colour and design, turning their ideas into wonderful imaginative creations.

From fantastical creatures to real life models, their projects often show some intricate details. The modelling not only improves their fine motor skills, and strength, but also encourages collaboration and creativity.







#### **Forest School**

This week saw the turn of 2MO to spend a creative afternoon in our woods. It was wonderful to see the smiling faces returning... with quite a lot of mud, too!







### Reading

Every ten days, Year 2 welcome Year 8 for early morning reading! All of the pupils read with a Year 8 buddy and take enormous pleasure and pride in their time together. It is extremely special to see the kindness and support that all of the Year 8s demonstrate; a hugely valuable time for everyone involved.















#### **Biomes Day**

As an exciting start to our topic of 'Biomes', Year 3 set off for the woods last week where the children were given some mystery boxes containing a map of the world. From clues that were gradually given, they worked out the biome for their box and identified the countries in which it can be found. They were then set the challenge of becoming the Year 3 'experts' for that biome so they could then present their knowledge to the rest of the year group.

Back in class, the children did some more research in teams, using books, information pages and the internet. They shared facts with their teammates. They were also able to 'visit' their biome using the VR goggles.

We very much look forward to listening to some fascinating presentations.













#### **Appreciation**

Pupils in Year 3 have started an exciting new initiative of learning about appreciation. They have given much thought to what this means and have discussed ideas as to how we can show appreciation and gratitude for all we have. From a long list of fabulous ideas, the children chose to start by making cakes for everyone who works at Hazelwood School to say thank you for the amazing jobs they do.

The children started bright and early on World Kindness Day and made rice-crispie cakes for the catering team, the office staff, the grounds staff, the accounts department, teaching staff and many others. They made beautiful cards, with some very touching messages inside, and delivered them, with the cakes, at break and lunchtime. It was an amazing team effort!

We had some lovely messages back from staff members and the children took great pleasure in showing their appreciation. Great work, Year 3!

### **All Rise Legal Workshop**

The Year 4 children thoroughly enjoyed their topic day on Friday, exploring the rule of law and the British court system. They discussed the importance of different laws, looked at evidence and also acted in their own courtroom!















#### **History**

Year 5 ventured outside to learn about the battle of Hastings. They were given a map of the battlefield and key information about the Norman and Saxon armies. The hill besides the tree house was used to recreate the start of the battle, the children had to identify geographical, military, and other advantages each side held over the other. The children will conclude their focus on 1066 with a short

report accounting for the Norman victory.



#### D&T

Year 5 have completed their first wood work project in the workshop using a new set of tools and equipment to make a wooden initial for their room.

From a coping saw to a belt sander they have taken on board the new skills and machinery with confidence and enthusiasm. Well done year 5.













### **Geography**

Year 5 enjoyed investigating why people migrate to the UK by analysing Push and Pull factors. We used England's most famous migrant - Paddington Bear - as an example!











#### **Science**

Year 6 have been investigating antacid tablets and trying to find the one that works best.

Tablets used were Rennie, Gaviscon and Bisodol.

Pupils could design their own investigation and really enjoyed the chance to test different variables.



Results are still being processed.













### **Food Tech**

Our Year 7 Food Tech elective enjoyed making - and eating - apple crumble last Friday. Toffee sauce added to the excitement!





### **Geography**

The Year 8s have been studying the US election as part of their topic: Dictatorship and Democracy. We were fortunate enough to be able to study this complex and fascinating process as it was running. The pupils were challenged to analyse the policies proposed by both the candidates and then formulate their own predictions about the impacts these polices might have on the US. We also looked at the American electoral system and made some comparisons between it and the UK.









### **English**

Year 8 pupils have been working collaboratively to prepare for their mock English Common Entrance examination next week.





#### **Graphics**

Year 8 Graphics students explored Canva to create a fun "Polaroid pop-up" effect, making their chosen photo subjects look like they were coming out of the frame! By layering images, cropping, adding shadows, and fine-tuning details, they learned key photo editing design skills. The class showed great creativity, experimenting with angles and backgrounds to bring their pop-up effects to life – an impressive introduction to Canva's powerful editing tools!











## **Sport**

#### **Football**

The Under 13 Boys won their final match of the season 2-0 away to Holmewood House. It was a hard-fought victory, Hazelwood dominated possession but had to wait until the last 5 minutes when they scored both goals. This completed an unbeaten run for their Wednesday fixtures, played 6 won 6.



#### **Gymnastics**

Our U11 gymnastics team did a fantastic job at the Surrey Schools Floor and Vault competition, with each of our gymnastics displaying skill, determination, and enthusiasm.
