What I love most about my job is witnessing the remarkable progress the children achieve and seeing them grow into confident and curious learners. Watching them develop new skills and build friendships is so rewarding—it's a privilege to be part of that journey!

WHAT MOTIVATES YOU?

I am constantly motivated by the children! Each day brings new surprises, as they impress me with their ideas, questions, energy, and curiosity about the world. Witnessing them achieve their goals and celebrate their achievements is what fuels my passion for teaching!

HOW DO YOU MAKE A DIFFERENCE TO CHILDREN'S LIVES?

I believe I make a positive impact on pupils' lives by offering a secure and supportive environment where they feel empowered to explore, make mistakes, and grow. Helping to establish a caring and curious environment for them I hope helps to develop a love for learning. I aim to help them develop not only academically but also emotionally and socially.

WHAT ARE YOU LOOKING FORWARD TO THIS YEAR?

This year, I'm most looking forward to and currently enjoying, being part of the wider school community now that we've moved to the main site. It's exciting to see how the younger children will interact with the older pupils, and I'm eager to collaborate more with teachers and classes from other year groups. On a personal level, I'm excited to continue growing as a teacher, learning new strategies to engage the children and improve their early learning experiences.



Wrens

The children have settled in well in the Wrens group! They have been engaging in messy play activities related to our farm theme, such as spaghetti play and water play. They have also been creating farm animals using their handprints and puffy paint. Additionally, the Wren children have been enjoying exploring the sensory and garden area.











Starlings

The Starlings have been settling in wonderfully over the past few weeks. They are happy and have been enjoying playing with new toys and exploring their new room. They have shown a keen interest in farm animals, singing along to "Old McDonald" and imitating animal noises. They have also enjoyed sensory activities like sequin boards and shapes with different textures. There have been various messy play activities that the children have enjoyed, such as mixing paint with shaving foam and cleaning mud off toy animals.











Wagtails

The Wagtails have settled in nicely in their new room and have been getting to know new friends. They have been having fun exploring the classroom and discovering new toys. They have shown enthusiasm for learning about different animals like tigers, sheep, and pigs. Wagtails have been engaging in various messy play activities with items like pasta, conditioner, cereals, and rice. They have been using tools like tweezers and paintbrushes for exploration. The children have been creative with art, painting pigs, tigers, and making turkeys with their hands.





Lower Robins

This week in Lower Robins, the children have been very busy and have settled in well, adapting to the new routine and environment. Many happy faces greet us as they arrive in the morning, waving goodbye to their parents.

Throughout the week, the children have engaged in a variety of activities, such as painting, cutting, and their first P.E. lesson, which they all enjoyed. In the second week, we focused on exploring the children's families and asked parents to bring in a family photo for our family tree display. The children had great fun sharing and discussing who was in their photos.

During the third week, we delved into the story of 'The Three Bears', discussing their behaviour and the story itself. The children particularly enjoyed creating puppets, engaging in size ordering activities, colour recognition games, and a fun cooking activity with Beth where they made bears' toast using honey, banana, and raisins. Next week we topic is 'The three little pigs' 🐱













Upper Robins

Last week, the children have been discussing their families by looking at family photos, creating a family nest for the Robins, and exploring shapes in messy trays. They have also been adjusting to new routines in the Upper Robins room. The children enjoyed their music lesson with Mrs Fryer and the PE lesson. This week, they had a lovely Autumn walk exploring the natural areas, collecting autumn materials, making hedgehogs with playdough and twigs, and threading autumn leaves.







Skylarks - Green

It has been a brilliant start to the new academic year in Skylarks' Green. The children have settled happily into their new environment and are keen to participate in all the activities on offer. We initially gauged the children's interests and preferences through a variety of engaging activities and then, this week, we have extended this into our focus on 'All about me'. The children have celebrated their similarities, and differences, via self- portraits, paper plate faces and by compiling their unique 'All about me' photo albums.

We have matched numerals to the quantity of our family members and started to learn new vocabulary to describe our feelings and emotions during circle time. The children also enjoyed their first swimming classes and will be joining Gary for their initial Forest School session later today.











Skylarks - Orange

The last two weeks at Skylarks have been absolutely lovely! The children have been brimming with joy and confidence as they settle in. They've been really busy exploring all the cool stuff in the classroom and having fun outside in the gardens. From building sandcastles to making fabulous mud cakes and pies, and even whipping up some special Skylarks stick soup – they've been creative little wonders!

We've also been working on an "emotion tree" together to chat about how we're feeling. It's been great to see them opening up about their emotions, what makes them feel that way, and how we can handle different feelings. The children are also super excited about their "All About Me" books. They can't wait to share stories about their families and the exciting adventures they've been on. It's just heartwarming to see them proudly showing off pictures and telling us all about their loved ones.





Reception

Settling into Reception

Our first week was all about helping the children settle into their new school environment. We introduced the Three Bears Rules:

- Daddy Bear (Safety): How we can stay safe, such as walking in school.
- Mummy Bear (Caring): Being kind, using kind hands and feet.
- Baby Bear (Learning): Always trying our best and helping each other.
- Goldilocks (Perseverance): Encouraging the children to keep trying, even when things feel tricky.

The children reflected on these rules and shared their own ideas on how to follow them. It was a great opportunity to help them understand the importance of these values.

The Colour Monster and Talking About Feelings

We also read The Colour Monster story, which helped us explore different emotions and the colours that represent them. The children shared how each emotion made them feel and learned that it's okay to feel a wide range of emotions throughout the day.

Families and Sharing Holidays

We discussed our families, celebrating how everyone's family is unique and special. The children enjoyed drawing pictures of their families and talking about the people they had included. We also shared stories about our summer holidays, taking turns to listen and speak—a great way to practise communication and social skills.















Reception

Superheroes!

In our second week, we introduced our new topic: Superheroes! The children were thrilled to dive into the story of Supertato. We began creating superhero landscapes, working on the backgrounds and cutting out squares and rectangles for the buildings. The children loved talking about Evil Pea and the vegetables from the story. This led to a great discussion on why eating vegetables is important, supported by the fun advert "Eat Them to Defeat Them!"

We also explored Superworm and talked about what makes a superhero. The children shared their ideas about how superheroes help others, drawing connections to their own lives and the people who help them. We even used an AI website to help the children create their own superheroes! The children described them and the AI made it into an image.

Writing: Think Write and Harriet the Cow

We introduced our first Think Write character, Harriet the Cow! The children began practising Harriet's starting shape and will continue exploring different ways to form this shape in the coming weeks.

Harvest Festival Preparation

Finally, we've started practising for our Harvest Festival. The children have been singing songs and learning their harvest poems with enthusiasm. It's wonderful to see them so excited about our upcoming celebration!

Maths: Noticing, Sorting, and Counting

In maths, we focused on comparing objects by noticing what's the same and what's different, then sorting them into sets. We practised counting groups of numbers and explored different ways to represent numbers, such as making unifix cube towers and using tweezers to move the correct number of gems into bowls.

Maths: Writing Numerals and Numberblocks

In maths this week, we worked on the rhymes for writing numerals 0-5. The children practised thinking about where each number starts and ends to form them correctly. We also explored the Numberblocks characters for numbers 1-4, discussing how each number is made and what it looks like.

Forest School

Year 1 had a fabulous time in their first Forest School session! The sun was shining and we loved searching for shapes, colours and textures in the natural environment, as well as climbing trees to challenge ourselves!







Reading

Year 1 have been thoroughly enjoying reading lots of fiction and non-fiction books in their new classrooms in and around the Baily building!











Topic Day

Topic Day - Is Plastic a Good Thing?

Year 1 enjoyed a fun-filled Topic Day where the children began to think carefully about the question 'Is Plastic a Good Thing?' The children had an exciting trip to the Outdoor Box and discovered that Mr Messy had had a very messy party! They did a great job sorting the rubbish for recycling!











History

Year 3 had an exciting time last week using the VR goggles to explore the Stone Age! They spotted Stone Age tools, entered dark caves and came face to face with a woolly mammoth and a cave lion! Looking carefully at what they could see, they answered questions about the Stone Age and considered what life might have been like at the time. Would we have survived the Stone Age?







Maths

Today Year 3 dienes to understand place value up to 10000. We recognised that we can represent numbers in different ways.





Volcano Day

Year 4 had a brilliant start to their topic, Active Planet! The day started with Lego construction of volcanoes in the box and volcano artwork. They then heard about the rumblings of Oxted Volcano, and as groups, decided what the ten most important things to pack when evacuating are. Finally, the afternoon ended with a bang! Year 4 created volcanoes out of junk modelling and then took them outside to start the eruptions, mixing bicarbonate of soda and vinegar together. An excellent way to end the day and start the topic!



The Hazelwood Relays Cross Country event was a resounding success, with an impressive 279 children participating across various age groups. Key Highlights

U13 Girls

The standout performance of the day came from the U13 girls' team, who secured an outstanding **2nd place finish**. Their teamwork, perseverance, and strategic running helped them achieve this impressive result, earning them well-deserved recognition.

U13 Boys

Not far behind, the U13 boys' team delivered a strong performance, achieving **3rd place** in their race. This result demonstrated the boys' determination and growing skill in cross country running, highlighting their potential for even greater success in future events.

Team Effort Across All Age Groups

Hazelwood entered four teams in each age category, ensuring a broad representation in the competition. Both boys' and girls' teams across all age groups gave their best efforts, with many children taking part in competitive cross country for the first time. Despite the challenging conditions, every runner showed resilience, determination, and a willingness to push their limits.

Looking Forward

The Hazelwood Relays set the tone for a strong cross country season ahead. Competition Highlights

The event proved to be an excellent starting point for the season, giving the team the chance to test their abilities and identify areas for growth.

Royal Russell School (U8-U11)- Our younger swimmers also had a fantastic opportunity to compete against Royal Russell, many for the very first time. The gala served as an exciting introduction to competitive swimming for these young athletes. Their determination and enthusiasm were evident throughout the event, laying a solid foundation for future galas. 4 School records were broken in the process over 25m; Imogen Zurrin in the Year 3 Frontcrawl, Max Castell in the year 5 Backstroke and Jack Laman and Sienna Carley in the Year 3 Breastroke events. A massive congratulations to those children!

Team Spirit and Enthusiasm

Beyond the races, the true success of the day was the camaraderie and team spirit displayed by every swimmer. Each child gave their best effort, supported their teammates, and left the gala with valuable experience. There were smiles all around, and the swimmers' joy in participating was clear.

Looking Ahead

This first gala of the year serves as an excellent starting point for what promises to be a successful season. While the swimmers have shown solid performance early on, the team is ready to work hard, improve their techniques, and make significant progress in the months ahead.

I am a Surrey Arts teacher from Surrey County Council music service that visits Hazelwood. All cello applications need to be registered with Surrey Arts as per the flyer above using the QR code, which will take you to the application form.

Stringbabies is taught in a group scenario, usually in groups of 2/3 and we also arrange the hire of the cellos for your child. They are timetabled within the school day, and I collect the children once I have had their timetables and agreed this with Mrs Haydock.

Once we have the application, we can begin to organise your cello and timetable the lessons. I look forward to meeting your child and beginning their musical journey!






