Courtney is a fantastic athletic role model and we hope to inspire pupils to pursue their passion in life.


By taking part in the circuit, we are raising money for new sports equipment in school, as well as supporting athletes and para-athletes, so they can continue to inspire the next generation.

## Blossom

The Blossom room has had so much fun doing lots of transport activities. They have been getting very creative and have been sponge printing trains, making shape cars, handprint traffic lights and paper plate boats. In the messy tray they have been washing different transports, pushing boats through jelly play, playing with planes in gloop and running cars over zip bags full off paint. We have also had fun in the garden by exploring coloured spaghetti play, moving diggers in the sand pit and building in the construction area. The children have enjoyed listening to different vehicle sounds and choosing what songs they want to sing at carpet time. Blossom have enjoyed doing different transport puzzles and mark making on pictures of transport. We have moved our room around and the children are enjoying playing in the bigger home corner and playing with the babies. They are enjoying doing our music sessions in the hall and singing different actions songs with the other orchard children.



## Maple

Maple class have had a wonderful few weeks! We've been diving into the 'transport' theme, and the children have had a great time making their own paper planes and testing them out with the staff. They've also been working creatively with shapes to construct transport-related items. This week, they've been busy crafting sailboats from paper plates, and they're really enjoying our new slide in the garden as well!



# Nursery



## Willow

We have had such a fabulous time listening out for Dinosaurs and stomping around like the biggest heaviest Dinosaur they could be. Lots of paint has been used to make coloured dinosaurs and long spiky tails. This week we have explored space. Building rockets with wooden bricks, using their hands to print an Alien with however many fingers they chose to paint. We have made a telescope to look at the stars and used torches to hunt for glow in the dark planets and stars in the sleep room. We all had a go at space yoga in the hall and making sparkling stars to look at with the telescopes they made. Lots of outside play in the sand pit that has been filled up plus exploring water to melt foam shapes and shaving foam and moon sand.



## Elm

This week in Elm, our theme has been 'People Who Help Us'. The children have had a wonderful time exploring various jobs and the vehicles that go along with them. We even did a fun activity matching numbers to those on a fire engine! Additionally, we've focused on 'Healthy Smiles', discussing the importance of brushing our teeth and enjoying nutritious foods. Last week, we learned about farm animals and birds. We took a lovely bird walk around the nursery and visited the pond area, trying to spot some feathered friends. We spotted a magpie, some crows, and even a little robin! To tie into our theme, we also enjoyed the story 'A Squash and a Squeeze' and chatted about what might happen next, encouraging the children to name the animals in the story.



# Nursery

## Birch



Birch have had a lovely few weeks, they have been learning all about space and the different planets, they have made their own moons using tinfoil dipped in paint, they have also been designing their own rocket ships and using them to fly all over space! After exploring the topic of space, the children then looked at healthy smiles, they were encouraged to brush teeth in the messy tray using shaving foam and brushes, they then explored healthy and unhealthy foods that we eat. The children also made a delicious fruit pie, during which, they explored numbers around the edge of the pie and counted the fruit used for it. They have also loved playing in the garden, they have been racing each other on the bikes and pushing balls down the gutters into water.



## Hazel

After successfully wrapping up our dinosaur theme, the children expressed a keen interest in flying dinosaurs, which inspired us to explore the topic of Birds and Birdwatching. They engaged in enjoyable activities such as counting feathers, feeding birds with worms, and creating colourful parrots. We also had an exciting birdwatching adventure at the pond area. Additionally, we read the book "Wow! Said the Owl," which introduced the children to the features of owls and the seasonal changes in leaves throughout the year. This week, we're celebrating Healthy Smiles Week, and it has led us to the theme "People Who Help Us." We incorporated activities focused on healthy eating and the importance of proper dental hygiene. During Healthy Smiles Week, the children at Hazel had a fantastic time brushing giant teeth in the tuff tray using toothbrushes, toothpaste, and water. They learned how important it is to brush their teeth every morning and night, and even after meals! This fun activity helped them understand that keeping our teeth clean is essential for achieving those Healthy Smiles. We also printed images of healthy and unhealthy foods to discuss with the children, helping them recognise which choices are better for their well-being. As part of our theme, we explored various professions and engaged in role play in the hall, pretending to be firefighters and dressing up in different costumes.



# Nursery



## Pine

The Pine children have had plenty of interstellar fun these past few weeks as 'Space' dominated the activities on offer in the room. They were inspired by the role play area being transformed into a spaceship to play imaginatively and cooperatively, using the astronaut dressing up and accessories to enhance this play. The 'small world' rocket and alien land provided another intergalactic backdrop for 'pretend' play, interaction and specialised language. We learned the names of the planets in our solar system and then marble-painted 2D planets to contrast with our 3D papier-mache planets created earlier. We investigated the properties of the textured 'moon sand' in the tuff tray, fashioned star constellations out of skewers and large marshmallows and worked together to make a huge class rocket complete with every child's photo. The theme then grew to encompass aliens and monsters too. We discussed our feelings and emotions with reference to 'The Colour Monster' books and had fun hanging numbered underpants on our washing line which reflected the content of the 'Aliens love underpants' books. We made 'cut and stick' monsters, independently drew our own aliens and created individual playdough aliens too. Great fun!



## Acorns


The Acorn children thoroughly enjoyed their focus on the exciting topic of 'Space'. They showed great recall as they learned the names of the planets in our Solar system and the characteristics of these planets. This prompted the children to then create their own planet representations using a variety of colours, textures and effects. We also fashioned space rockets out of both Duplo and pre-cut shapes. The Space themed tuff tray instigated a lot of imaginative and descriptive language and we read exciting stories that were out of this world! We extended the theme to cover aliens and monsters too. This provided an opportunity to read some 'Aliens love Underpants' books which inspired the children to make their own aliens out of playdough and practise their fine motor skills as they used pegs to hang their underpants on the washing line!



# Reception



## Literacy

Reception children are enjoying writing in a variety of contexts, including adding labels to their drawings and writing sentences about models they have created.

The children rose to the challenge and wrote some wonderful journey stories, and as a result, the whole map was revealed! To everyone's delight, the completed map turned out to be of our school site.

The Map Keeper then invited us to visit a special location on the map, where the children discovered a treasure hunt as a reward for their hard work and creativity. Alongside this, we have been learning about the UK, exploring cities and towns, including our local area of Oxted.


## Maths

In Maths, we have been using the part-whole model to support our understanding of addition and subtraction, missing number sentences, and fact families.

## PSHE

In PSHE, through Zippy's Friends, the children have been learning about what makes a good friendship. They have enjoyed role-playing communication and listening skills and continuing to practise strategies for managing feelings such as sadness and anger.

We have also been proudly taking part in the whole-school Kindness Collective, tracking our acts of kindness and celebrating the thoughtful choices the children are making every day.

## ENGLISH

**James and Yusuf were inspired by a prep comprehension task to describe their own 'roboid'. We really enjoyed their writing!**


## DT


## Kent Championships 2026






## Bookmark Competition (12<sup>th</sup> Feb) & World Book Day (5<sup>th</sup> March)

Please ensure you have your bookmark entry in by 12<sup>th</sup> February so that they can be considered for the competition. Results will be out just after World Book Day.




