

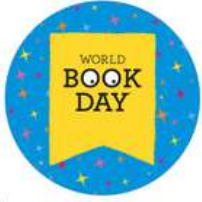

Blossom

The Blossom children have had fun with the tiger who came to tea planning. They have been having tea parties in the home corner with soft toys and having lots of picnic snacks. The children enjoyed decorating their own biscuit and listening to the tiger who came to tea story. They have been very creative by using bubble wrap and rollers to print stripes on orange paper. The children have also made their own tiger masks and making lots of cups of tea in the messy tray. They have also been finding their orange and black objects on the black table.

The children have also been doing activities to do with monsters and aliens. The children have been making their own handprint monsters, using droppers to paint a picture of an egg and creating their own monsters using different coloured paints. In the messy tray the children have been exploring foamy water and playing with the castle small world. The children have had so much fun playing in the garden in the sunshine with the balls and painting the transparent wall.

Maple has had an exciting few weeks! We have been looking at the topic of space, exploring different activities such as making our own telescopes and playing with space rockets! This week we have been exploring under the sea, making handprint turtles and stingray sun catchers!

Willow

Last week in Willow, we learnt all about shapes and colours. The children had lots of fun hunting for shapes hidden around our garden. We have also been printing paint using shape cutters and matching shapes together. The children had a go at threading cheerios onto pipe cleaners to create their own individual bracelets. We have had fun exploring rainbow coloured paints. We also went on a nature walk around the nursery site and talked about the different colours we could see.

This week in Willow, our topic has been the Rainbow Fish. The children enjoyed making their own fish shaped sandwiches where they used cutlery to spread jam or marmite independently. We have been painting with cotton pads to create our own coral reefs and have been exploring a Rainbow Fish themed tuff tray with sand, coloured oats, pasta, rocks and shells.



Elm

This week in Elm, we have been focusing on books. The children thoroughly enjoyed sharing their personal books from home during circle time. They also kept busy in the tuff tray, creating their own bookmarks with various materials and bingo paints. We baked gingerbread men, which the children delighted in devouring for their afternoon snack. On Thursday, we will celebrate World Book Day, and the children looked fantastic in their costumes.

Last week, our topic was superheroes. We discussed what superpowers the children would like to possess. The pansy group created their own superhero capes, which they absolutely loved decorating. Meanwhile, the Daisy group engaged in superhero training, enjoying the challenge of moving in different ways.

Birch

The children in Birch started off learning all about Valentine's day, they made cards to take home for their families, they decorated them using heart shaped cutters and bubble paint. Birch have also celebrated Chinese New Year, which was year of the horse, they made their own lanterns and did this by cutting them out, they also decorated their own yummy Chinese menus by sticking a variety of images onto some card. The children also enjoyed exploring the colourful rice and chopsticks in the messy play, some even had a go at using the chopsticks to pick up the rice. During our Chinese New Year celebrations, the children also enjoyed pancake day, they had yummy choices for their toppings on their pancakes such as lemon and sugar and jam! They also made their own pancakes using playdough and rolling pins. We have also enjoyed reading lots of different stories during world book day, and the children showed up in some amazing costumes and spoke about what book their character was from! The children have also enjoyed playing in the lovely sunshine, they have really enjoyed climbing on the new climbing frame and practicing their throwing and catching skills with the ball and hoop too!



Hazel

After a wonderful celebration of Chinese New Year, the children in Hazel expressed an interest in farm animals. We encouraged them to explore the interest table we had set up, themed around the farm, helping them learn which animals belong there. The children had a blast expressing their creativity with paint as they created animal prints on paper. When we discussed what else can be found on a farm, they mentioned farmers and tractors. Using various tools, like toothbrushes and their fingers, they made prints of these items. In addition to this, the children took part in activities such as matching farm animals to their homes and pairing baby animals with their parents while learning their names. This week, as we celebrate World Book Day, the children in Hazel have been focusing on their favourite books. They kicked off the week by having a fantastic time exploring their beloved stories and searching for Superworms in the tuff tray, alongside enjoying tales like "We're Going on a Bear Hunt." The children listened to "The Three Billy Goats Gruff" and engaged in discussions with questions that enhanced their understanding of the story. They then headed out onto the decking to act out the story. To celebrate World Book Day, the children dressed up in costumes representing their favourite characters.

The children in Pine class have been absorbed in the celebration of a variety of diverse festivals and special events these past few weeks, all designed to further enhance their understanding of the world. 'Healthy Smiles Week' highlighted their grasp of making healthy choices with regard to food, drink and oral hygiene by collaging healthy plates of food, making toothbrushes and practising their brushing techniques. 'Number Day', in support of the NSPCC, provided opportunities for counting, sorting, number recognition and estimating, which was closely followed by Chinese New Year. This colourful, vibrant festival really captured the children's imagination as they used all their senses to explore the traditions of dragon dancing, the giving of red envelopes, eating with chopsticks in our Chinese restaurant and making lanterns.

St. Valentine's Day and Shrove Tuesday also prompted the learning of new, specialised vocabulary via fun, age-appropriate activities. We have also visited the topics of 'Construction' and 'Fairy Tales', the latter in preparation for and coming 'World Book Day'.

Acorns have had a fantastic past few weeks! We have been busy exploring stories with our topics of fairytales and traditional tales! We have been busy creating magic wands, royal crowns and strong shields as well as our own book marks and story covers! The sun has been shining which has meant plenty of outdoor play, the children enjoyed playing with some new additions to the garden such as skittles, bean bag tossing and a lovely reading area! The children are incredibly excited for the sun to stay, but rain or shine, we'll have fun!

While exploring minibeasts this week, the children have been learning all about different tiny creatures. They enjoyed using natural materials such as leaves, twigs and stones to create their own minibeasts, encouraging creativity, fine motor skills and lots of discussion.





What can old toys tell us about life in the past?

Over the last two weeks, we have launched our new topic about toys with an exciting topic day. Our big question is: What can old toys tell us about life in the past? We began with the story *Lost in the Toy Museum*. Each class discovered their own toy and a mysterious CCTV picture of Bunting from the story. The children carefully investigated the clues, made predictions about what might have happened, and shared their ideas about the story and characters.

Our Fabulous Finisher will be creating our own Year 1 Toy Museum for other classes to visit. The children will use their photographs, write information about toys, and even design and make some toys themselves to display in our museum. Following the trip, the children wrote both a class and individual recount about their visit.



Science & Maths

In Science, we have begun our new learning about animals. We started with some fun animal-thinking games and have begun learning about mammals. In Maths, we have been exploring length and mass, using cubes and scales to measure, compare, and describe the length, height, and weight of different objects.





Forest School

1A had a wild time in the woods this week, locating who calls the woods their home, making dens, whittling wood, winching treasure up to the top of a tree and using chalk to draw sunny pictures. A beautiful afternoon in the sunshine was had by all!





Trip to Penshurst Toys Museum

A highlight of the fortnight was our wonderful trip to the Penshurst Toy Museum. The children explored the museum, played with a range of old toys, handled historical artefacts, ordered toys from oldest to newest, and even made their own thaumatrope to take home. While we were there, we also took photographs which will be used as sources for our topic work and for our upcoming "Fabulous Finisher".

Year 2 stepped back in time for their Ancient Egyptian Topic Day last week.

The children looked fantastic in their creative costumes as they took part in a range of exciting activities, learning all about life in Ancient Egypt, such as learning to write their own name in hieroglyphics!

All the money raised is being donated to Parkinsons UK and any books left over will find new homes through the Children's Book Project.

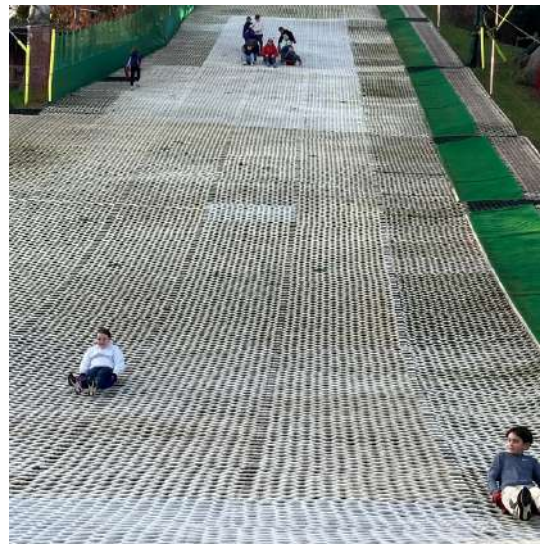

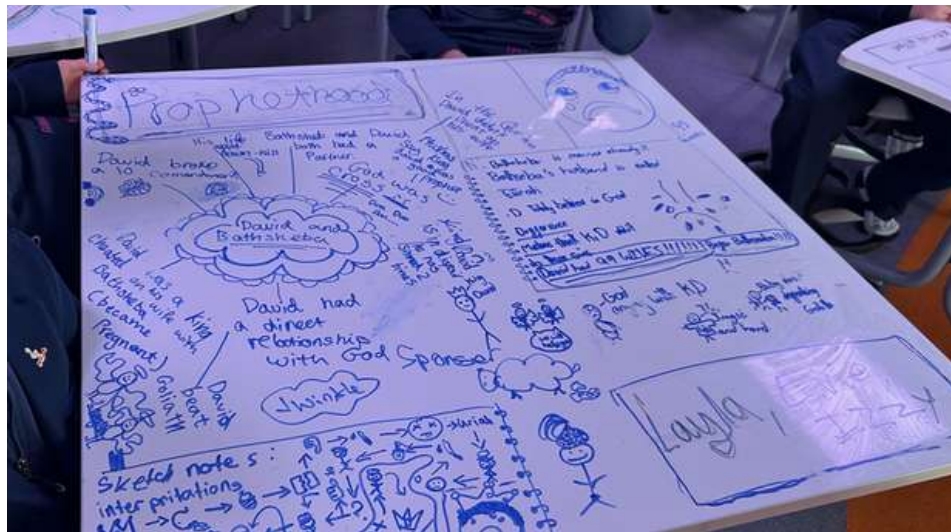
It was truly a fantastic day at a senior school setting where they behaved impeccably, learned enormously and achieved great success.





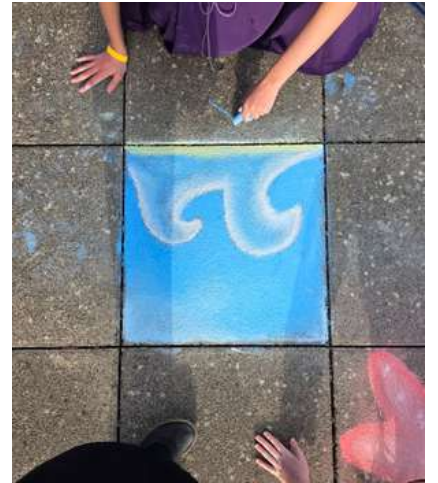

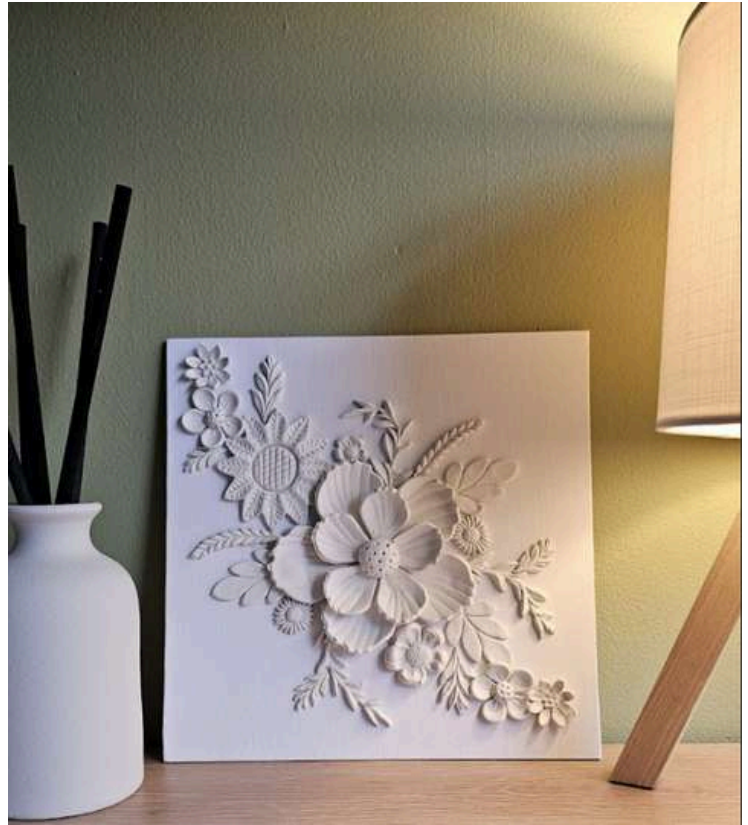
