Fledglings 1

The children have had a great start settling into Fledglings 1 and the new routine over the last two weeks. They have been learning all about "Old MacDonald Had a Farm" and the different animals. The children have been making their own puffy painted pigs and using tractors to make marks on pieces of paper. They have had fun exploring the mud and pigs in the messy tray. The children have also been exploring shaving foam sheep and making handprint chicks. Additionally, they have been using corks to print spots on their cows. The children have had so much fun pouring water down drainpipes and exploring different colored water. Fledglings 1 children have been exploring playdough and making marks on Old MacDonald's barn.















Fledglings 2

WOW! A fantastic first two weeks for our new Fledglings 2 children as they get stuck into exploring! They have been busy on their new adventures, transitioning from home fantastically. We have had lots of different activities on offer for the children to choose from, such as shape sorting, sensory shapes, peg puzzles, talking to their parents on the pretend phone, sticking with glue sticks using different types of materials, animal printing using paint, and matching different colored objects. The children have enjoyed lots of play in the garden with the beautiful sunshine and heat, so we introduced water play consisting of ice, colored water, and lots of objects like boats, fish, pouring tools, and more. We have had freeflow activities in the garden with books, musical instruments, a sandpit, and a slide. To top it off, in Fledglings style, we have had lots of messy tuff tray play with shaving foam, oats, flour, sprinkles, mud, and hay.













Lower Robins

We have had a lovely couple of weeks settling into Lower Robins. The children have enjoyed exploring the new environment and getting to know their peers and the adults looking after them. We have been exploring nursery rhymes; the children have been singing along to familiar songs and joining in with the actions, as well as creating some beautiful artwork. We have also been getting to know the children and what they like. They have enjoyed choosing and sticking some of their favorite things to make a collage with their key person. Some of the girls were very keen to tell us about the princesses they like the most! Lower Robins have also had fun splashing in the water during the very hot weather and exploring our outdoor area. Well done, Lower Robins, for settling into the room so well!













Upper Robins

In Upper Robins last week, the children settled really well into the room and enjoyed exploring all the different areas both inside and outside. They enjoyed lots of water activities to keep themselves cool and have particularly liked creating a collage with their favorite things on it. Also, the children enjoyed their first music lesson with Mrs. Fryer. There has been lots of singing and exploring different materials in the messy tray.

This week in Upper Robins, the children have continued to settle well and explore all the different daily aspects of the room and the nursery. This week, they particularly loved making their family nests for our family board. They really loved looking at the different members of their families, pointing at the pictures with a great big smile. They have also loved making marks in the flour using paintbrushes and looking for shapes in the shredded paper.









Skylarks - Green

We have had a fantastic start to the new academic year on the Green side of Skylarks. Children familiarized themselves with their new environment, exploring the new resources and activities on offer, including the 'messy' tuff trays, the home corner, the cozy reading area, the large outdoor area, along with the 'small world' toys and construction resources. We focused on our 'All about me' topic, highlighting the children's personal, social, and emotional development and their understanding of their family unit and what makes them personally unique. We have created self-portraits, paper plate representations of our facial features, and have also started compiling our individual 'all about me' photo albums. We spoke about our likes and dislikes and tried to extend our vocabulary to describe how we were feeling and our emotions during circle time. There was also great excitement surrounding our first swimming session, and we look forward to the start of Forest School next week!











Skylarks - Orange

What an incredible start to the year for Skylarks Orange class! The children have been so happy and confident coming into the class, and we are very proud of how well they are doing! During our first week, we focused on settling the children, including a variety of familiar stories, games, and fun craft activities to encourage the children to explore the class freely. For our second week, our topic is 'All about... me!' and the children have been busy talking about their families, lives, and of course... themselves! All of the children have now created their own self-portraits, and we have begun making 'all about me!' books! We look forward to continuing this topic next week!











OAK



Getting to know you



Oak classes have had an amazing start to the term! We have delved into the story of The Colour Monster by Anna Llenas, exploring all of the emotions that are covered in the book. We have listened to music, created our own artwork and had meaningful discussions about how we feel and what we can do to regulate negative emotions such as sadness, worry, or anger. Oak has also discussed the Three Bears Rules, which help keep us safe and happy at school. We have had lots of time to explore our new classes and the decking area, playing with lots of different toys and accessing the resources independently.

Oak has started a new topic titled "Who is Super?" We have been reading superhero stories and creating mind maps to explore what the children already know about superheroes. Many children said that their parents are superheroes! We have also created pictures of ourselves as superheroes and started working on an artwork that illustrates our own superhero city.















The children had fun practising laying the table in preparation for lunch time. They then created food from plasticine and worked on using their knife and fork.









Year 1 enjoyed their topic day, beginning to think about whether plastic is a good thing. This generated lots of interesting discussions. To begin the day Mrs Wisniewski read the children a story about a turtle who ate some plastic, but fortunately she was rescued. Following on from this, Year 1 enjoyed time in The BOX. They used VR googles to explore under the sea, created and drew machines and vehicles to collect rubbish from the oceans.

In the afternoon the children sorted lots of rubbish that Mr Messy had left in the outdoor area and enjoyed locating letters and rearranging them to make the word "litter". Thank you to Mr MacDougall for helping the children with this.












Year 2 Chocolate Day

On Monday, Year 2 had a fun-filled Chocolate Day with cookery, chocolate art, a chocolate tasting and a quiz.

We made our own chocolate art using rice paper, melted chocolate, sprinkles, buttons and Smarties. We had to work quickly, before the chocolate set. We were able to take a bite!

We made chocolate cornflake crispy cakes! We wrote out the recipe and then ate our cakes. Yummy!











Year 2 took their maths learning outside this week and using chalk to make a Hundreds, Tens and Ones grid, made some three digit numbers using leaves, twigs and stones! A leaf represented 100, a twig 10 and a stone 1.



Topic Day - Active Planet

Year 4 started their new topic, Active Planet, with a brilliant topic day! The children came dressed in volcano-themed outfits and showed their fiery spirit throughout the day. They started with 'the floor is lava' team building games in the Outside Box and showed super collaboration and communication to complete the tasks. After that, they went to the Box and created volcanoes in a variety of innovative ways; with lego, through VR headsets and creating volcano sounds on an iPad. With excitement, they headed to the firepit and used their five senses to describe the fire.

Finally, they ended the day creating volcanoes through their artwork; blow painting, collage and watercolour.

An excellent day for the whole of Year 4!















Science - What's really out there?

Year 5 have fully immersed themselves in our topic Earth and Space. Last week, they went on an extraordinary journey, one that took them beyond the classroom into the vastness of space. Our VR headsets allowed them to fully understand the sheer scale of Space. Continuing to understand the heliocentric system, we headed out of the class to understand the planets' orbits around the Sun -Neptune had a lot of walking to do!









Geography

Year 6 enjoyed using the new VR headsets to help further their understanding of plate tectonics. During this week's lessons, the children were able to navigate their way down through the layers of the earth, giving them a true idea of the sheer size of each layer. They also were able to 'walk' around the four different plate boundaries and watch the processes occurring right in front of them.









Year 7 Camp Out

Year 7 had a brilliant night camping out on the bank pitch last Friday. From splashing around in the pool to bags of sweets being won by the winners of the quiz, it was a brilliant way to start the year. Along with team building games in the sports hall, the pupils feasted on hotdogs for dinner in the Hazelwood Room and toasted marshmallows and hot chocolate at the teepee. But the highlight of the evening was hearing renditions of Backstreet Boys, YMCA, and the Moana soundtrack being sung at the top of everyone's lungs while bonding around the campfire. Year 8 Maths Extension & Scholarship


Already underway with thought-provoking problems, consider what happens when, contrary to usual teaching, the numerators and denominators of 2 fractions are added.



The Children's Book Project

We are again running the collection of new and nearly new (but in very good condition) books for the Children's Charity in the run up to Christmas.



Across London and the UK, 1 in 4 disadvantaged children owns fewer than 10 books, whilst 1 in 8 has none at all. This has an impact not only on these children's academic outcomes but also on their wellbeing, emotional development and sense of themselves as a reader.

The Children's Book Project directly tackles this_'book gap' and gifts donated books to targeted communities across the Capital. These schools and community groups put on celebratory book gifting events at which children are invited to choose a book to take it home and keep. The charity expects to gift upwards of 70,000 books this year.






