Fledglings 1

Over the last two weeks, Fledglings 1 have been learning about jungle animals. The children have enjoyed making different jungle animals for our display board. They have also been making their own animal print matching books and threading pasta onto a piece of string to make a snake. The children have also been looking at daddy, mummy and baby lion pictures and seeing what they can recognise. The children have enjoyed making bear toast and jungle animal biscuits. The children have had lots of fun playing in the garden with the swampy water play. They have also been making structures out of the mega blocks to what they think an animal looks like. In the cosy corner we have been having puppet shows with our new jungle puppets. The children have had lots of fun exploring the jungle sensory bags and making different jungle animal sounds. They have also enjoyed rescuing the lion from the jungle jail and exploring the jungle den.



Fledglings 2

Arrr Ahoy! Fledglings 2 have been enjoying learning about the life of pirates! They have been having lots of creative fun making their own pirate hats, treasure maps using teabags, sticking shapes to make boats and sticking colourful feathers on to parrots. As it's been getting super-hot the children have been loving all the water play with our new bamboo gutters mixing different coloured water using lots of tools and boats.

They have also been using water to clean the pirate ships and putting their hands in water with beads to look for hidden fish. Fledglings 2 have been busy with lots of free flow activities such as colouring in pirate pictures, pretending to walk the plank, using tweezers to pick up coins and building their own ship with mega blocks! And if that wasn't enough, they have also been enjoying adult led activities matching colour and shapes using pegs, matching different size seashells, matching different flags and exploring shells and pebbles in playdough.













Lower Robins

Our topic in Lower Robins has been Pirates. The children have loved making their own treasure maps using teabags to stain paper. We have also been playing the Pop Up Pirate game, taking it in turns with our friends to each have a go. The children made some brilliant telescopes using cardboard and shiny coloured paper. We have been reading stories about pirates at circle time and have been exploring our small world pirate ship.

We have also been looking at different forms of transport. In the garden, we created a role play car wash and the children had fun riding the cars through it. The children took part in a creative activity to make a Robins bus using paints and glue. We have been wheeling cars through different coloured paints to create tracks and explore colour mixing. At circle time, the children have been engaging in group discussion about what types of transport they have used.



















Upper Robins

Last week in Upper Robins we have been looking at the topic of holidays. The children have particularly loved looking at their holiday photos and talking about them to us and their friends. The children have enjoyed playing in their ice cream shop that they made last week, making their own ice cream using shaving foam, sprinkles and other toppings. They have also been using their fingers and paintbrushes to make marks in the ocean tray. The children have spent plenty of time outside in the garden and on the grass practicing for sports day. The robin's children have loved practicing singing summer songs for their concert later this month.

This week in Upper Robins we have continued the theme of holidays/summer. With the nice weather this week the children have enjoyed lots of water play and they have especially enjoyed having lots of fun in our new paddling pool, where they have loved going down the slide and splashing each other! Also, this week the children have been making Father's Day cards and painting portraits of their dads to take home for their dads on Father's Day. The children have enjoyed playing in our Robins travel agents, telling us where they would like to go on holiday and making their own passports to take on holiday with them. Lastly this week they have been designing their own flip flops and practicing singing for our summer concert.













Skylarks - Green

The children on the Green side of Skylarks have been extremely busy since the last edition of The Nutshell. We concluded our topic on 'Eco Week' with a litter walk around the nursery site and by recycling plastic bottles into musical instruments. We discussed the effects of pollution on the environment and learned the meaning of the word 'conservation'. We also iced some biscuits to resemble our planet, Earth.

Last week, 'birds' dominated our learning, culminating in an exciting day trip to 'Eagle Heights Wildlife Centre'. Here the children behaved very well as they witnessed eagles, caracaras, owls and falcons feeding and flying up close, independently asking pertinent questions of the knowledgeable handlers. In the classroom we made our own birds, using our fine motor skills to fold the wings, made textured nests, learned about the life cycle of the owl and fed the cardboard 'bird' specific letters and numbers using tweezers.

This week we have extended our learning to encompass wild, jungle animals. The children have gone on safari in our jungle role play area and build up scenarios around the 'small world' jungle and swamp backdrops. We have worked creatively to produce lion masks and spiral snakes and chosen a selection of animal patterns and fabrics to make our own wild animal. We have still had time to practise for our up-and-coming Summer concert and make some keepsakes for daddy's special day on Sunday. Busy, busy, busy!!











Skylarks - Orange

WOW! What an incredible week the Skylarks children had. The children enjoyed making bird nests and painting the three baby owls from the story 'Owl babies' and exploring counting on the whiteboard. The children were very engaged in the topic of birds and owls which was extended by taking the children on a trip to Eagle heights! The children had a fantastic time watching the bird displays, having a Caracara bird walk around their feet, exploring the other animals and of course having a play on the playground. We would also like to say a big THANK YOU to our parent volunteers who came with us on the trip, the children really enjoyed the day and that was supported by you!

There's been a rumble in Skylarks this week as we've explored jungle animals! The children have been busy painting jungle animals, playing with them in messy play and completing puzzles of animals around the world! We explored jungle animals stories and songs and the children have built their own jungle scenes using various construction resources.











OAK

Reception Class

The Oak children had an exciting pastoral day to start the new term and introduce the second part of their topic, "Do you want to go on a journey?" They used Google Earth to locate their houses and other significant landmarks, created maps to find the Gingerbread man, and followed an obstacle course to map out the story. Additionally, they acted out the story, made Gingerbread man pictures, and went on a sensory hunt to use their senses to describe what they could see and hear.

On Thursday, we had an exciting trip to Chestnut and visited both the inside and outside Box. Our visit began with a lovely tour of the building where we met some adults and listened to a story. We then explored the Outside box and played with Year 1 and 2 children in the Chestnut playground. After that, we shared our learning in the inside Box and had lunch in the lunch hall before returning to Oak. We had a fantastic morning, and when we got back, the children all shared their favourite parts.

At Forest School, the children enjoyed exploring and expressing their creativity by drawing on trees with chalk. Additionally, they had the opportunity to cook their own sausages over the campfire for a delicious hotdog.

In maths, we have been measuring weight, measuring the ingredients to make gingerbread men, and using the Gingerbread men we made to measure the length of other things. We certainly enjoyed eating our gingerbread men! We have also been looking at doubles and sharing equally between two.

During the wonderful weather we have been having, the children have been enjoying making mud cakes in their new mud kitchen out on the decking.

















Literacy

To help Year 1 recall the plot of "Cinderella" in detail for writing they have learnt actions to the story. This is part of the Talk for Writing approach by Pie Corbett which, in the first stage helps children learn and internalise the text. Can you guess which parts of the story the children are performing?







Plants

The children learnt about the lifecycle of a plant. They talked about what plants need to grow and survive and where the best place for a plant would be. They spent some time on the Chestnut playground looking at different plants, sketching them and labelling them.







Science Nature Walk

The children took part in a nature walk hunting for different natural objects. They loved exploring the school grounds, observing and learning about the environment. During the walk, we bumped into Mrs Bilbrough and she showed Year 1 the best spot to look for creepy crawlies. They also located different flowers, plants and leaves.

Art Club

In Art Club Year 1 and 2 have looked at the work of the artist Van Gogh. Using pencils, felt tips or pastels they created their own interpretation of his famous series of paintings of sunflowers and "Starry Night".

















Persuasive Speeches

Recently, we have been learning how to write persuasively and the special language that this entails. Using our class text as inspiration (The Lorax by Dr Seuss), the children assumed the role of the Lorax in his bid to save the environment. After learning how to write persuasively, they then wrote a persuasive speech in the role of the Lorax, addressing the Onceler. Their aim was to persuade the Onceler to shut down his factory and save the environment. Once the speeches were ready, the children went outdoors to create the scene. As the Lorax does in the original text, they stood on a tree stump to present their speeches to the Onceler - they focused on how to deliver their speeches in such a way as to convince the audience. I think we can safely say that all of the Oncelers were well and truly convinced by the powerful persuasive speeches!





Rainforest Day

To launch our new topic for Summer 2, the Year 3 children enjoyed a special 'Rainforest Day'. The first activity of the day was to lead their own research on rainforests. Using various resources, including iPads and books, they chose which areas they wished to find out more about. They then worked in small groups to present their findings in books, which they created by themselves.

Next, the children headed to our very own Hazelwood rainforest! There, they had to hunt for images of various animals that they would find in the rainforest. Once each group had found an image, they were then faced with the challenge of building a suitable habitat for that particular animal. Lastly, the afternoon was spent creating rainforest dioramas using cardboard boxes that the children had brought to school, along with a range of different

art and craft materials.

The list of activities have been endless, including archery, survival skills, rock climbing, forest adventure, team building and marshmallows around the campfire. 
Titsey Estate Walk








Legoland

The Year 6s enjoyed a brilliant day in Legoland. The sun shone and the children enjoyed a great mix of rides and creative freedom with lego building.















Maths



"You're never too old to learn the ukulele!"



Annabelle N's exceptional performance in the U13 50m Freestyle resulted in a 10th place finish in the finals, setting a personal best time of 30.72.

The swimmers' dedication and hard work were evident throughout the competition. Their achievements not only showcased their abilities but also set new benchmarks for their respective schools. The IAPS Swimming Championships Finals 2023 was a testament to their talent, perseverance, and commitment to excellence.






